An online photo management application is an application that facilitates the upload, management and display of images on the web.

## 1.1 Examples of online photo management applications

**Flickr** - The best online photo management and sharing application in the world, enable new ways of organizing [photos](#).

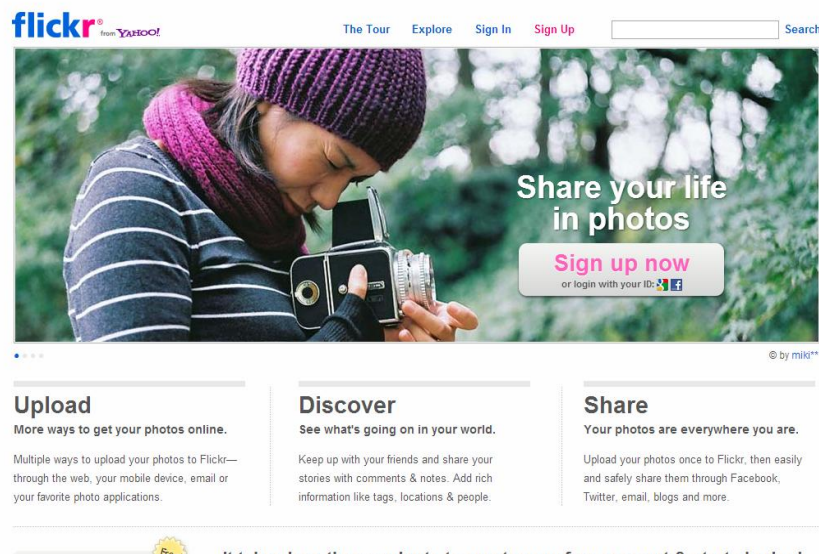


figure 1 : flickr

**Picasa** - Picasa is a software download from Google that helps you organize, edit, and share your photos. It's free, and easy to use.

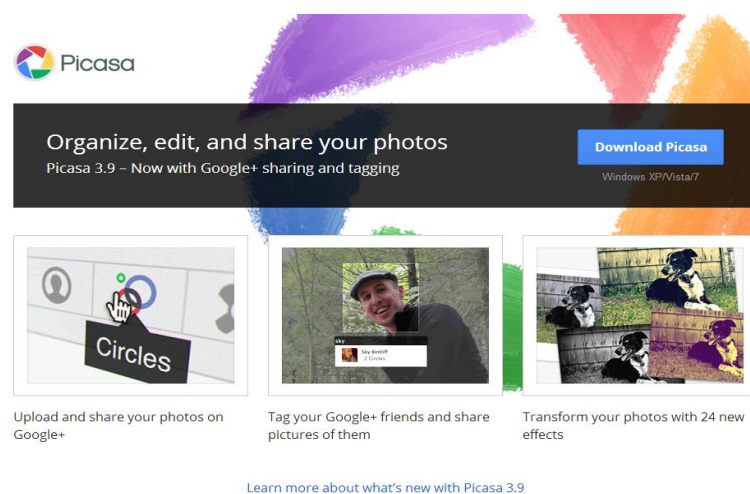


figure 2: Picasa


## 2. What is flickr

- ① [Flickr](#) is a popular photo-sharing and hosting service with advanced and powerful features.
- ① It supports an active and engaged community where people share and explore each other's photos.
- ① You can share and host hundreds of your own pictures on Flickr without paying a dime.
- ① There's also a pro service that gets you unlimited storage and sharing for about \$2 a month, making it one of the cheapest hosting sites around (more on that later).

## 2.2 Creating your buddy icon

- ☉ Every flickr user has a 48x48 pixel buddyicon used to represent themselves.
- ☉ You can use images
  - From your flickr account
  - From your computer
  - From the web




figure 5: Buddy icon

## 2.3 Choosing your custom Flickr URL

- ① Click on **Choose your custom Flickr URL**.
- ② Input the custom URL you'd like to have.
- ③ This can't be changed so choose wisely!



**Your account / Your own Flickr address**

You can specify an alias for yourself that will form your own unique Flickr web address. Once you have settled on an address you like, you can share it with all your friends!

Pick a "permanent" alias that will appear in your Flickr web address, like "christlep" or "pickles". **This can't be changed later, so choose wisely!**



### 3. Upload Photo

There are two way that you can upload a photo.

#### 3.1 1<sup>st</sup> way

From the Flickr homepage – if you are uploading photos for the first time, there should be a link called **'Upload your first photos'** on the left hand side of your homepage, in a blue box. There is also a link called **'Upload Photos & Videos'** on the right hand side of your homepage.

#### 3.2 2<sup>nd</sup> way

From any Flickr page – you can find the upload page any time by selecting the drop down menu under **'You'** and clicking on the link called **'Upload Photos and Video'**.

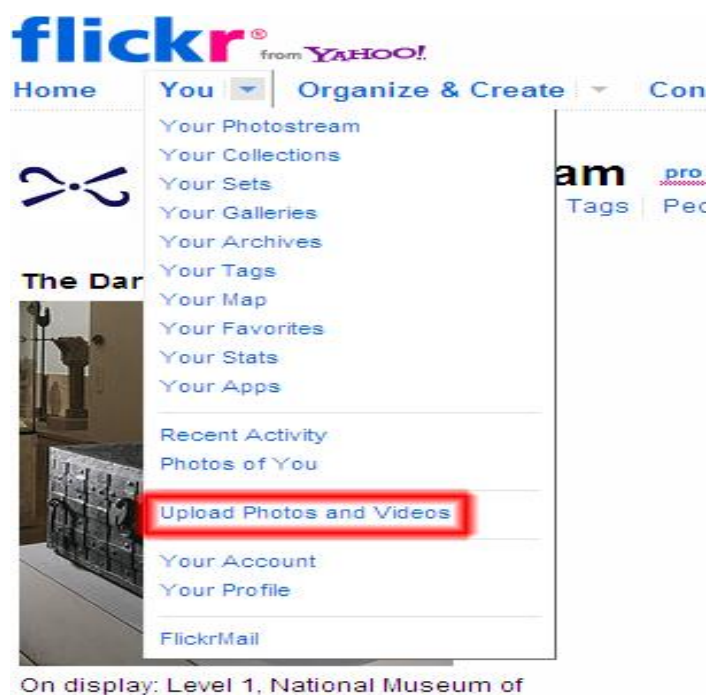


figure 8: Upload photos and videos



### 3.3 Steps for uploading

- ① Find the images on your computer
- ② Add any relevant tags
- ③ Choose your privacy settings – if you are intending to share your images with any groups remember to select **‘Public’**
- ④ Click “Upload”



Many Flickr users have chosen to offer their work under a Creative Commons license, and you can browse or search through content under each type of license. Creative Commons is a non-profit that offers an alternative to full copyright.

## 4.2 Why choose creative commons license

- ⦿ Liberal use and sharing of your photos
- ⦿ Reasonable copyright protection


Before adding creative commons make sure that:


- **your work is copyrightable**
- **you have the rights**

## 4.3 Add creative commons license

## 4.4 Set a default license

### Your account / Set a default license

When you upload something via the Flickr website, it will inherit the default license type you set here.

You should only license photos you own the copyright on.

Browse the existing content on Flickr licensed under Creative Commons.

#### Select a default license

Don't forget to make sure that you have all the necessary rights and you won't be infringing on any third parties with any content that you license on Flickr. As per our [Community Guidelines](#), accounts are intended for members to share content that they themselves have created.

This will apply to everything you upload from now on. You can also change the license on all your existing public content in a [batch](#) if you wish.
