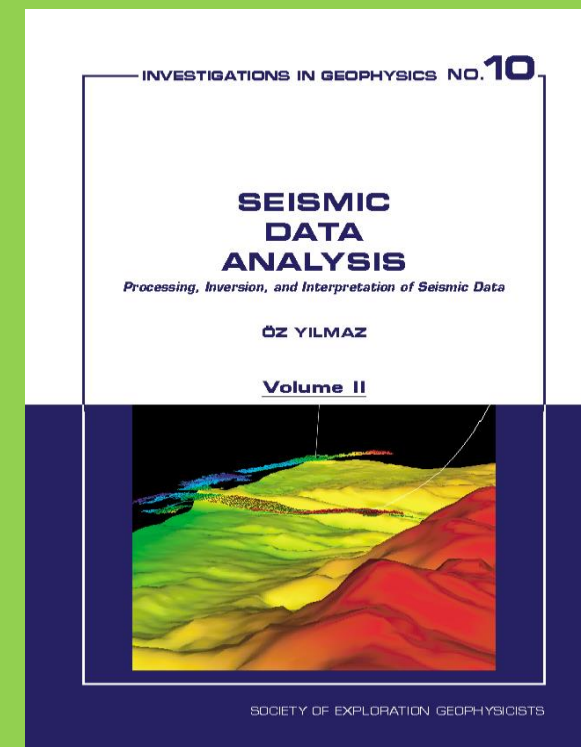

Types of contributors

- **WikiGnome**: makes useful, incremental edits. Work behind the scenes, typing up loose ends and making things run smoothly.
- **WikiFairy**: organizes messy articles, improves style, adds color and graphics, clears up confusing footnotes or references, standardizes format.
- **WikiDragon**: contributes dramatic, bold, and often grandiose edits. These enhancements and improvements are often based on their vast knowledge or intense Googling.
