

## Solving the drama between Who, Whom, Whoever, Whomever

Your task is to design a short play that examines who and whom in relation to the object and subject of a sentences. Include the following requirements.

Quality: All sentences correctly use who, whom, whoever, and whomever.	20 points	
Your play must tell a story and include the parts of a story. It must have a beginning, middle, and end. It must have plot: conflict and resolution.	10 points	
Quantity: 5 who, 5 whom, 5 whoever, 5 whomever, are used in the narrative and/or dialog.	10 points	
Choose to create either a comedy, tragedy, or horror. It must be clear to the audience which you are performing.	10 points	
Creativity: Audience's entertainment. (Audience will score you one through ten on your creativity and entertainment value.)	10 points	
Set crew: Whom, who, whomever, whoever are labeled throughout the play. A background/ setting are developed between skit. You may draw on the white board. (12 seconds max between scenes.)	10 points	
Individual Participation: Each group member will be the narrator, actor/actress, and crew (label cards, setting, etc) of at least one scene.	10 points	
Each group member must submit a copy of this rubric with his or her name on the top left corner and an open office document with a minimum of 10 sentences that include who (5), whom (5), whoever (5), and whomever (5). These sentences have to be written by the individual and correctly use who, whom, whomever, and whoever. Also, follow MLA format.	20 points
