Requirements of the MYP:

In each year of the MYP, students must use a developmental workbook (DW) which reflects their development, their investigations and some record of the process of creating artwork.

MYP Arts guide (2000)

Visual arts: drawing, painting, sculpting, ceramics etc—they involve working towards creating artwork. There is a strong emphasis on the process of creating and on reflecting.

Criterion: reflection and evaluation

	Descriptors
0	You don't describe what you did or how you did it. No opinion or personal response.
1-2	You describe <ul style="list-style-type: none">• what you did but there are hardly any other ideas about how you did it. Some opinion or personal response is present.
3-4	You describe <ul style="list-style-type: none">• what, how and why• what worked well and what didn't. Your opinions and personal response are clearly stated.
5-6	You explain <ul style="list-style-type: none">• what, how and why• changes you made along the way with your reasons• the problems you had and your ways of solving them• how successful the final result is. Your opinions/personal response are stated with some depth.
7-8	You explain <ul style="list-style-type: none">• all the reasons behind what, how and why• your creative process and problem solving• how successful the final result is• the improvements you would make next time and why. Your opinions/personal responses are stated in depth.
