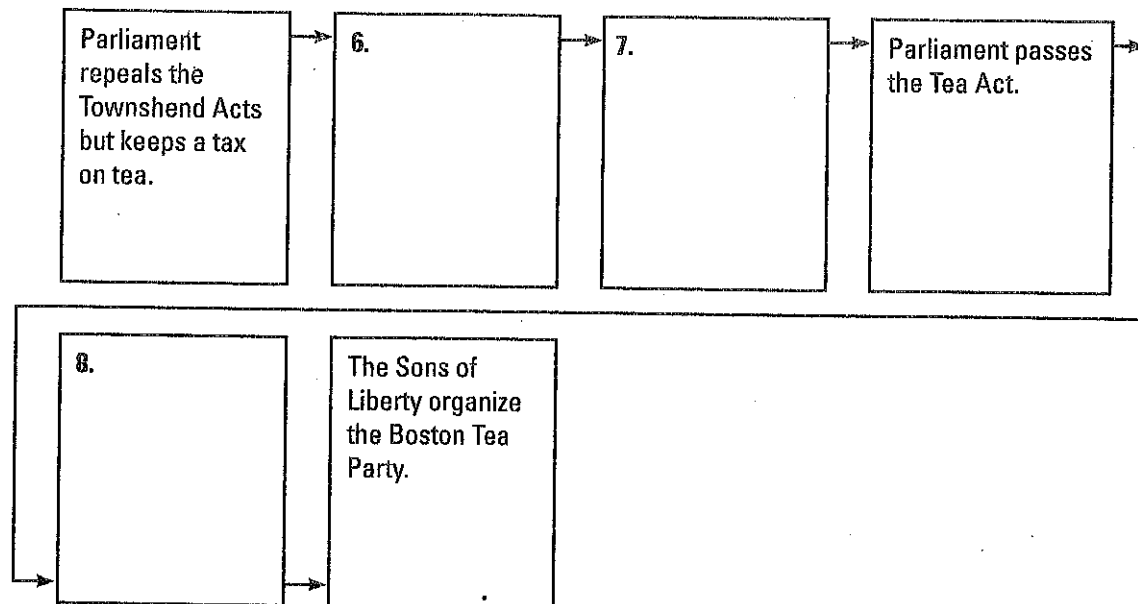
Colonists become more angry—even those who wanted peace.
