• Translating

• This is a reflexive: it acts as an intensifier.

1. As an adjective:

• Use -self, as in: him/her/itself themselves

Ex. puer ipse: the boy himself

Ex. puella ipsa: the girl herself

Ex. templum ipsum: the temple itself

* the noun and the form of ipse must agree in case, gender, and number.
