

Questions

You have already met many sentences in Latin which are questions; their form is not unlike that of English questions.

They are usually introduced by an **interrogative** (question asking) word, such as:

Cur – why

Quis – who

Quomodo – how

Ubi – where, when

Quid – what

Quantus – how big, how much, how many

Sometimes in Latin, the interrogative ending – **ne** is attached to the first word of the sentence.

Sometimes, **nonne** is used to ask a question.

Examples:

Venis**ne** ad ludum = Are you coming to school?

Nonne ad ludum venis = Aren't you coming to school?
