### Future Tense:

1st Singular	audiam	I will hear
2nd Singular	audies	you will hear
3rd Singular	audiet	he will hear
1st Plural	audiemus	we will hear
2nd Plural	audietis	y'all will hear
3rd Plural	audient	they will hear

### Imperfect Tense:

Person	Latin	English
1st Singular	audiebam	I was hearing
2nd Singular	audiebas	you were hearing
