

• Locative

↳ Locative/location: The locative is the place in/at which you are located

• It utilizes genitive and ablative endings only

↳ it is a 'defunct' or 'dead' case, that is only used in select words

• The locative is used for ~~towns~~ towns, cities, and small islands (specific, named geographic locations)

Roma → Romae "in/at Rome"

Corinthus → Corinthi "in/at Corinth"

Athenae → Athenis "in/at Athens"

• Special words used in the locative:

heri → yesterday

humi → on the ground

domi → at home

ruri → in the country

vesperi → in the evening

* Remember: the locative does not require a preposition to express its function.
