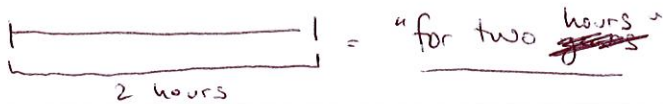


• The Accusative of Time (pg. 20) OR (pg. 22/23)

1. The Accusative of Time is called the "duration of time" - it tells you how long an ~~action~~ action takes

2. We can visualize the acc. of time as a timeline:

Latin Exs: • decem annos Graeci Troianos obsidebant

("For ten years The Greeks were besieging The Trojans")

• tres horas ambulavimus

("For three hours we walked")
