<p>ASSIGNMENT OBJECTIVES AND ORGANIZATION</p> <p>Your project meets all aspects of the assignment and accomplishes the objectives. It is organized and composed of ideas that flow in a sensible order.</p> <p>Your project meets the length requirement (2-3 pages with 500-750 words total) and it is apparent that you read and are familiar with the books.</p>	You followed the outline completely and wrote at least 700 words.
