What is the message that he delivers and to whom?	What does the banner that hangs in the center of town say, and why is it ironic? Give a detailed response.
300	Who feels that his friend is stuck in the past and is unwilling to accept change? What is the quote that shows this? You may paraphrase!	How does Howard’s testimony help Cates? How does Howard’s testimony harm Cates?	Why does Cates teach evolution to his students? Give a detailed response to support your answer.	Explain the story about “Golden Dancer.” What is the lesson and what is the symbol?	Explain the reason why Rachel decides to leave town with Bert. What are her views on evolution?
400	Who requires or seeks the approval of a parent even though that person is adult? Give two examples of that person “heeding” or yielding to a parent.	Describe or explain what Drummond does just before the end of the play. What does he do and what symbol is represented by his conduct?	Why does Rachel testify against Bert as a witness for the prosecution? Give two detailed reasons for her cooperation with Brady.	In your own words and new language, restate the quote: “How do you write an obituary For a man who’s been dead thirty years?”	Describe how Brady goes from hero to zero. Give detailed examples of his VIP status and then how the town looks at him later.
500	What behaviors show that this character may be a religious person despite being called a “sinner”? Give a specific example to support your response.	What is the difference between Cates at the start of the trial and at the end? Give a specific textual example to show how he has changed.	Why does Drummond call Brady as a witness for the defense? And how does Brady testify; what kind of witness is he? Use detailed examples.	Who is he talking to and what does Drummond mean he says, “You have no more right to spit on his religion than you have a right to spit on my religion. Or my lack of it!”	What does this quote mean? “He that troubleth his own house . . . shall inherit the wind.” Explain your response by addressing what happens to Brady or Rev. Brown.
