

MYTH PROJECT

Due Friday

May 19th

1. Make a Minecraft world depicting the characters and scenes from the myths that you have studied or create an architectural structure like an aqueduct, a temple, the Pantheon, or the Colosseum.
2. Rewrite your favorite myth. An example would be Percy Jackson and the Olympians. This project should include some of the original myth. It must be at least two-pages long and must be typed.
3. Make a collage or create a diorama or a flipbook illustrating a scene or scenes from your favorite myth.
4. Some myths, like the kidnapping of Persephone, were created to explain certain occurrences in nature. Write your own myth to explain some aspect of nature. An example might be why there is thunder and lightning. This project should be at least two-pages long and must be typed.
5. Create a new god or goddess. Things to include: name, gender, history of birth, powers, attributes, symbols, duties, and an illustration. Everything but the illustration must be typed.

6. Make a travel brochure advertising a vacation to Ancient Greece or Ancient Rome to see the gods and goddesses. What are the main attractions? Where will we see the gods and goddesses? Make sure you illustrate the scenery and what the gods look like using your own drawing or pictures from a magazine or newspaper.

7. Create a video to reenact your favorite myth. Videos must be 5-10 minutes in length. You may work with a partner.

8. Create a video to reenact a typical day in the life of a Roman. Videos must be 5-10 minutes in length. You may work with a partner.

9. Create a power point with at least 10 informational slides telling us about a deity that does not come from Greek or Roman Mythology.

10. Create a life-like illustration on poster board of your favorite god, goddess, monster, or character from Greek or Roman mythology.
