

## Ablative of Time pgs. 22-23

1. The ablative of time describes two aspects:
  - a. At what point something happens → called "Time At which"
  - b. Within what time period something happens → called "Time Within which"
2. The ablative of time, like the accusative of time, is composed of two types of words: a number/amount word, and a time-word.
3. Time At Which: describes a single point in time, when something happens
  - a. It is always singular, and <sup>often</sup> uses ordinal numbers, like first, second, third, etc.ex. On The first day of school, all the students wore new shoes.  
time at which
4. Time Within Which: describes a length of time, within which something happens.
  - a. It is often plural, and uses cardinal numbers (like 1, 2, 3, etc.) and amountsex. Within three weeks, school will be over.  
time within which
5. Time At Which is translated as "at/on \_\_\_\_\_"
6. Time Within Which is translated as "within/in \_\_\_\_\_"
