

## The Nominative (pg. 24)

1. The Nominative case is The Subject of The sentence.

2. It will always be The Subject of a verb/action

Ex. puer scribit: "The boy writes"

Mundus vertit: "The world turns"

Scintilla filiam vocat: "Scintilla calls her daughter"

3. The nominative answers The question:

"Who/what is (verb)ing?"

Ex. "Who writes? The boy writes."

"What turns? The world turns."

4. A nominative noun can be translated into English as "a noun, the noun"

5. The Nominative can be thought of as "naming" or "getting" the direct object (accusative) from the subject (nominative)
