However, I did not recognize that we know lots of things about people in power – some are good, some are bad, some have accomplished great things, some may have no record of achievement. We never reduce people in power to a single, overarching account or description. We have far more complete understandings of who they are.	False. People without power are often portrayed by a single story.	In her TED talk, reflecting on her experiences growing up in Nigeria, Adichie is sensitive to how power shapes which stories we tell and how we tell them. She defines power as “the ability not to just tell the story of another person, but to make it the definitive story of that person.”
