\_\_\_\_4. She was the founder of Hull House, a settlement house for the poor in Chicago.

\_\_\_\_5. This “trustbuster” president filed suit against the Standard Oil Trust in 1906; in addition, he was devoted to conservation of the environment and a “Square Deal” for all.
