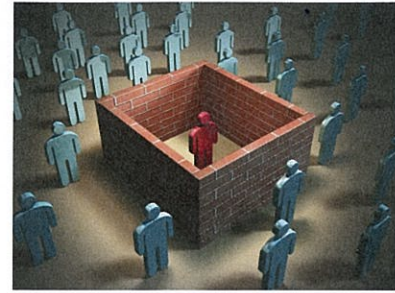


ISOLATION (ahy-suh-ley-shuhn) - noun
