

1. Reflexive pronouns are used to refer back to the subject of a sentence.

Ex. Marcus sees himself in the mirror

2. The 3rd person pronoun reflexive has only 4 forms:

	Latin	English
nom	—	—
gen	sui	of him/her/itself / of Themselves
dat	sibi	to/for him/her/itself / to/for Themselves
acc	se	him/her/itself / themselves (d.o.)
abl	se	—

* These forms are both singular and plural

* There is no nominative form

Ex. Marcus in speculo se videt

3. In Latin, certain expressions and verbs use reflexive pronouns:

Ex. Pueri se vertunt = literally: "the boys turn themselves"

↳: "The boys turn around"

4. Personal pronouns (ego, tu, nos, vos) can also be used reflexively:

Ex. Ego me paro = I prepare myself (I get ready)

tu te paras = you prepare yourself (you get ready)

nos nos paramus = we prepare ourselves (we get ready)

vos vos paratis = y'all prepare yourselves (y'all get ready)
