For example, a character or object may be the obstacle confronting the protagonist (main character). A verb may describe what the protagonist spends most of her time doing. An adjective may describe the setting or a trait of a key character.

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
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Put a star by the book that you decide to use for this project.

3. Second Word: Why is it important for understanding the book?
4. Third Word: Why is it important for understanding the book?
5. Fourth Word: Why is it important for understanding the book?
6. Fifth Word: Why is it important for understanding the book?
7. Conclusion: Restate all five words and summarize their importance
