Overview

Students in Arabic 3 will continue to explore the Arabic language and culture directly using the language to explore their interests.

Students will begin to engage more authentic materials available online and in print including the news and social-media.

Goals

Students in Arabic 3 will continue to develop their skills in reading writing, speaking and listening as they engage increasingly complex texts and situations. The course will aim to help students achieve the Intermediate distinction as outlined by the ACTFL proficiency guidelines. Students will be able to handle communicative tasks in straightforward social situations. The Proficiency Guidelines are available at: <http://actflproficiencyguidelines2012.org/>

Method and Practice

This course will be conducted primarily using the communicative method. This method of language learning asserts that everyone is capable of learning a new language. The primary method of language acquisition is communication **in** the *target language*. Therefore, classes will be conducted in Arabic with few exceptions. Students will have ample time to practice, make mistakes, and correct their errors.

Repetition is crucial to language learning. Language learners need to encounter a word at least seven (7) times before they begin to demonstrate acquisition. In order to be successful, students **MUST** practice outside of class.

Materials

Every class, students will need:

- Homework
- Paper
- Pencil/ Pen
- Text book and other distributed materials
- A binder, folder, or other means of storing handouts

Evaluation

Homework (20%):

Homework will be graded based on completion. Available on Wiki.

Class participation (25%):

Students should come to class everyday with their materials, prepared to speak Arabic, and ask questions.

Quizzes: (30%)

There will be a quiz approximately once per week.

Tests/ Projects/ Interviews/ Presentations (25%)

Usually 1-2 each quarter.

Studying

Each student will discover the method of practice that works best for him or her. Experiment with different modes of practice. Try studying alone, with a partner, and in a group.

Students will have access to materials including the text book, online videos, articles, presentations, YouTube videos, voice recordings and others. Students should explore other methods individually. These include:

- Flash Cards (paper or online) –Vocabulary lists –Self quizzes –Writing repetition
- Writing a song or poem –Oral repetition –Making a video
- Teaching a friend –Others

Expectations

Expectations:

Students can expect the teacher to be available for extra help

Students can expect the teacher to review new vocabulary, expressions and grammar more than once.

Students can expect the teacher to answer their questions to the best of his ability at an appropriate time.

Students can expect the teacher to be prepared, on time, and excited to have class.

Students are expected to:

Come to class on time and prepared,

Listen attentively and participate to the best of their ability,

Take risks; be unafraid to make mistakes,

Practice outside of class,

Support one another and have fun.

-Be on time!

-Speak Arabic as much as possible no English!

-Do not speak while others are speaking (soft repetition is permissible)!

-No food, drink, or gum in class. Water is okay.
