

Tempestuous

- Part of speech: NOUN Latin root: TEMPESTAS - STORM
- Dictionary definition: FILLED WITH STRONG EMOTIONS; STORMY
- Example sentences:
 - THE THANKSGIVING DINNER BECAME TEMPESTUOUS WHEN I WORE MY TRUMP HAT.
 - TURBULENT AND TEMESTUOUS ARE SYNONYMS.

Fury

- Part of speech: NOUN Latin root: FURO – TO RIOT
- Dictionary definition: WILD OR VIOLENT ANGER
- Example sentences:
 - SARAH'S DERISION FILLED MR. MARTIN WITH FURY!
 - AFTER THE BASKETBALL GAME, THE BOYS' LOCKERROOM WAS TEMPESTIOUS, TURBULENT, AND FILLED WITH FURY.

Vilify/Villain

- Part of speech: VERB Latin root: VILIS – SOME TRASH
- Dictionary definition: TO MAKE SOMEONE OR SOMETHING LOOK BAD BY SPEECH OR ANOTHER FORM OF COMMUNICATION
- Example sentences:
 - MANY POLITICIANS TRY TO VILIFY THEIR OPPONENTS.
 - MOST DEMOCRATS VILIFY TRUMP. (MOST DEMOCRATS THINK TRUMP IS A VILLAIN)

Invincible

- Part of speech: ADJ Latin root: VINCO - CONQUER
- Dictionary definition: NOT ABLE TO BE CONQUERED OR BEATEN
- Example sentences:
 - THE TEAM THOUGHT THEY WERE INVINCIBLE, BUT THEN THEY LOST.
 - SUPERMAN IS INVINCIBLE.

Ostentation/ostentatious

- Part of speech: NOUN Latin root: OSTENDO - SHOW
- Dictionary definition: THE ACT OF SHOWING OFF
- Example sentences:
 - I DRESS STYLISHLY WITHOUT OSTENTATION.
 - THE PLAYER'S OSTENTATION BOTHERED ME BECAUSE HE WAS SOME TRASH. (THE BASKETBALL PLAYER WAS OSTENTATIOUS.)
