

## AMERIMUNC Committee Descriptions:

### Session One:

1. MUN 101: This session covers the basics that every student participating in MUN needs to know to be a good delegate. This session will cover everything from how to prep for a conference to what a position paper is and how to write one. This session is recommended for beginner delegates who want to learn the basics.
2. MUN 201: This session goes a little bit beyond the basics of MUN. It seeks to help students who perhaps already know the basics become more confident both in and out of committee. This session is recommended for intermediate delegates looking to gain confidence.
3. MUN 301: This session is all about revealing some tips and tricks that most delegates can only learn from experience. AU's traveling MUN team has sat down and compiled a list of the most important things that no one tells you will help you in committee. This session is recommended for advanced students wishing to delve a little bit deeper into the world of MUN.

### Session Two:

1. Campus Tour: An interactive tour of American University's campus. Given by a student currently attending AU. This session is good for any student who is interested in learning more about American University itself. The tour will last around 45 minutes to an hour (the same length as the other morning sessions).
2. Student Panel: We will have a panel of five American University students available to discuss college life. They will begin by each telling a little about their experience at AU and then opening up to questions. Some examples of topics that will be covered are: how to find a roommate, how to get involved on campus, and how to best cope with the transition into college life. This session is recommended for students who are currently juniors or seniors and who have questions about either AU or college life in general.
3. Guest Speaker: We will be having a guest speaker come and give a presentation during the morning of our conference. While the speaker is a surprise, it can be assumed the speaker will have something to do with the field of international relations. This session is recommended for students who are interested in hearing from an expert in the field of IR.

### Session Three:

1. Public Speaking: This session will focus on teaching good public speaking skills. Some topics that will be covered include: body language, rhetoric, and speech techniques. This session is recommended for students who typically have a hard time speaking in front of their peers or for those who are good speakers but do not yet possess the confidence to raise their placards.
2. Writing: This session will focus on teaching students how to write in committee. Students will be taught how to write everything from notes to other delegates to resolutions, and notes to the dais. This session is recommended for students who don't usually find themselves integral to the resolution writing process.
3. Parliamentary Procedure: This session will break down parliamentary procedure. It will cover the points and motions that delegates will come across in every committee session as well as some that are less well known. This session is recommended for delegates who either does not know their parliamentary procedure or for those who are not yet fully comfortable with it.
