## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- **How old should writers be in order to attend Studio?**

We offer a variety of workshops and fellowships for writers of all ages. Our elementary fellowship program is open to writers ages 5-11, and our secondary fellowship program is open to writers 12-17. Fellowships involve one week of writing in the summer and monthly sessions on Saturdays during the school year. Some write with us during the summer or school year only, but many write with us year-round. We ask that you register separately for summer, fall, and spring sessions for this reason. *Try it Tuesday* sessions are offered each spring. This provides writers an opportunity to get to know us before committing to a fellowship.

- **Do participants have to be strong writers in order to attend?**

The purpose of the studio is to nurture each writer's love of the process. Writers of all experience and proficiency levels attend Studio sessions, and care will be taken to ensure that every member of the group feels valued and encouraged. We're here to have fun and grow together over time.

- **What is the mentorship program?**

Mentors are veterans of Studio who are interested in becoming teachers of writing in any setting one day. They study and implement promising practices within our elementary fellowship program. Mentors reflect on their learning, engage in inquiry, and discover what it means to teach writing *well* within the current education climate. Mentors attend their own fellowship program and workshops for free.

- **Will snacks be provided?**

Writers are welcome to bring their own snacks to Studio, but please know that we are a peanut free environment.

- **How do the year-round sessions for the fellowship programs work?**

We meet on the SECOND Saturday of each month from September through December and again from January through June. Elementary Studio fellows will meet from 9:00-12:00 am and writers in grades 6-12 will meet from 1:00-4:00pm. Mentors arrive one full hour ahead of the elementary program—at 8:00 am.

- **What is expected of each writer?**

While writers are not expected to write a certain type or number of pieces, they are expected to behave as kind and supportive community members. The way we speak to one another and treat one another at Studio has everything to do with the level of safety people feel here. This is critical to our success, and it is something that we work very hard to protect. Please know that writers who chose to behave in ways that are hurtful to their own progress or that

of others may be asked to leave at the Angela's discretion. ***If you question your child's ability to behave well or be supportive and encouraging to others, please do not send him or her to Studio.***

- **What supplies do writers need?**

All writers are provided the materials that they will need. They are encouraged to bring their own devices, should they wish to write with them, though. We have a growing number of tech tools available to writers at Studio, but we find that when writers bring their own devices, ownership increases and the transition between writing at home and writing with us is much smoother.

- **How does arrival and departure occur?**

Please plan to arrive on time so that we can let you into the building. Our space is secure, and if you are late, we may already be teaching and unaware that you have arrived. Lessons will not be disrupted to answer the door. Parents of elementary writers are asked to come into the building and sign their children in each day. Departure from Studio must happen in a timely manner. Parents of elementary writers must come into the building to pick up their children unless other arrangements have been made with Angela. If you intend to be more than five minutes late, please notify us. Fees may be assigned.

- **How are teachers selected?**

Studio teachers are New York State certified, experienced teachers who are practicing in local school districts. Every teacher in our program is a veteran fellow of our community. They participate in comprehensive training and receive mentoring throughout the year.
