College Application Deadlines

College applications due by January 1 will need to be turned in to the Guidance Office by December 14. Guidance counselors will NOT, under any circumstances, be expected to process college applications received the week of December 17-21. Therefore, students requiring applications to be mailed prior to winter break, MUST turn them in to their counselor by December 14. There will be NO exceptions! The Guidance Office will accept applications due after January 1 at any time and will process them upon return on January 2.

Seniors:

It's time to be thinking about future plans. Information about colleges may be gathered by making campus visits,* and attending presentations by college representatives that visit WHS. Wednesday, October 17 is an excellent day for seniors to schedule a college visit. This is the annual WHS test day where seniors have the following options:

1. Schedule a college visit
2. Make arrangements with an employer to job shadow
3. Stay at WHS and take the ASVAB – the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery Test

Seniors who choose to take a college visit or job shadow are excused for the day. They must make prior arrangements with their guidance counselor by October 8.

*NOTE: Juniors and seniors are permitted three (3) college visitation days per year prior to May 1.

The guidance counselors would like to make the following suggestions for seniors:

- **Take or retake the ACT or SAT college entrance tests to improve your score.**
- **Be aware of college admission deadlines and APPLY EARLY!**
- **Apply for financial aid in January. (Check to see if FAFSA instructions/forms are available in the Guidance Office)**
- **Complete the FAFSA online at www.fafsa.ed.gov, after January 1, 2013.**
- **Continue to take a challenging curriculum of classes.**
- **Make an appointment to meet with your guidance counselor to discuss your future plans – especially if you have senior privilege first or last period.**
- **Prepare an activity sheet of community/school involvement to send with admission and scholarship applications.**
- **Check bulletin boards in the guidance office for information about college visits and scholarships. Search out information on other options in addition to college – i.e. military, trade school, technical training.**

Juniors:

Some important points for juniors to think about and begin acting on this year:

- Sign up to take the PSAT – a test that could qualify you to become a National Merit scholar and receive money for college. Also, it is a good practice test for the SAT. The fee for the PSAT is \$14 and may be paid through Oct. 12 and will be given on Oct 17. Make checks payable to WHS. If you are NOT going to sign up for the PSAT test, you will be taking the ASVAB test – the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery test.
- Register and take the ACT or SAT sometime this school year.
- Begin your college search by visiting schools.
- Keep in mind the college prep core courses suggested for college success when planning your senior year schedule.
- Become familiar with admission requirements of schools of interest.
- Use the materials in the Guidance Resource Room.

Sophomores:

Sophomore students will take the PLAN test on Test Day, Oct. 17. PLAN gives sophomores an estimate of how they will score on the ACT. PLAN tests them in the same four areas as the ACT – English, Math, Reading, and Science. It also gives the students some insight as to what careers they might choose according to their abilities and answers they give on the career inventory section of the test. The PLAN cost was included in the student fees.

Freshmen and Grade 8:

On Test Day, freshmen and students in Grade 8 will take the EXPLORE which is an ACT college readiness test that includes tests in English, Math, Reading and Science. The EXPLORE Student Score Report gives information about knowledge, skills, interests, career plans, and the amount of help the student thinks they need in seven areas. The EXPLORE prepares students not only for their high school coursework, but also for their post-high school choices as well. It marks an important beginning for a student's future academic and career success.

Free and Reduced Lunch Yearly Verification

The state requires the Food Service Department to perform a random audit every year of three percent of applications currently on file. Verification packets will be mailed the first week of October. The verification requires participants with an income to provide copies of pay stubs and a list of members in the household with their social security number. Participants with a SNAP or OWF number must provide a copy of a SNAP or OWF approval letter with the case number. You must respond with the information requested by the date noted on the verification form. Failure to respond in the allotted time will result in termination of the participants from the Free Lunch Program.
