

CLINTON E. MISSLER SCHOLARSHIP

General Information And Application Procedures

The Clinton E. Missler Scholarship is created to provide financial assistance for those citizens of Wayne County who desire to further their education beyond high school level in the field of agriculture, farm economics, animal husbandry, animal nutrition & research, or soil and water conservation.

To be eligible to apply for financial assistance from the scholarship fund, each applicant must:

- A. Be a resident of Wayne County at the time of application;
- B. Have graduated from an accredited high school;
- C. Plan to further their education in one of the fields listed above, which education may, but not need to, lead to a degree.

Any person who meets the above requirements and desires to become an applicant for a scholarship shall:

- A. Submit high school and/or college transcript;
- B. Submit college aptitude test results (if available);
- C. Submit a statement of 300 words or less stating why applicant feels he/she should be considered for this scholarship (ability, future plans, awards, activities, achievements, interests, financial need);
- D. Be willing, if requested, to meet with the advisory committee or trustees for a personal interview.

Applicants for financial aid will be considered on the following:

- A. Scholastic ability
- B. Citizenship and character
- C. Financial need

The selection of the candidates to receive financial assistance will be determined as follows:

- A. All applications will be submitted to the Tri-County Superintendent.
- B. An advisory committee made up of selected staff members of the Tri-County Educational Service Center shall screen all candidates and submit one to the trustees.
- C. Application must be received by April 16.
- D. Financial assistance to students shall be distributed at the discretion of the trustees. Payment of the award will be made directly to the school.

The above rules and regulations are designed to create a fair and efficient scholarship program as desired by the founder of the scholarship trust. No person shall be excluded from any financial assistance because of age, sex, race, creed, religion, or politics.
