

VoiceThread

VoiceThread is a collaborative, multimedia slide show that holds [images, documents, and videos](#) and allows people to navigate slides and leave [comments in 5 ways](#) - using voice (with a mic or telephone), text, audio file, or video. You can have students add comments by creating Identities.

1. Go to <http://voicethread.com/> Click on Sign In or Register. Create an account, if your students will be signing into this account use a generic password.

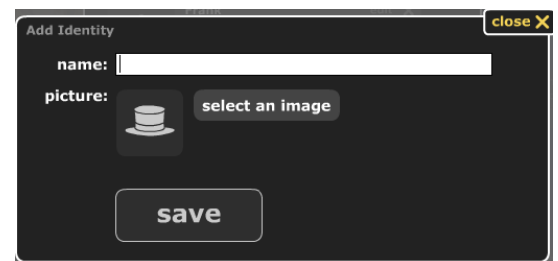
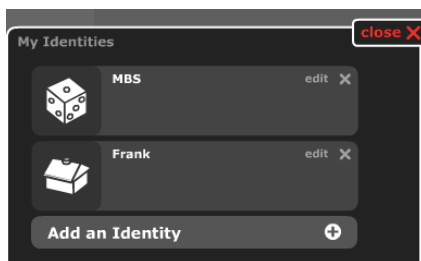
2. Click on Create to start your VoiceThread. To see VoiceThreads you have already created or VoiceThread tutorials click on MyVoice.



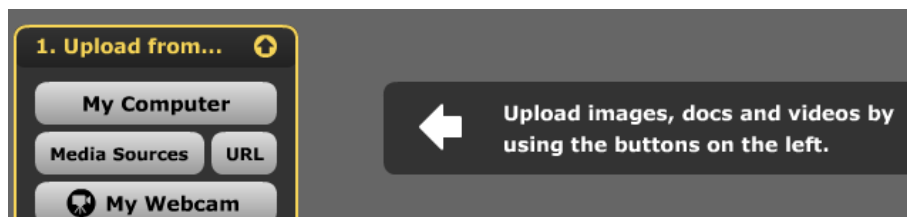
3. To create Identities for your students, click on your username (email address) on the top right. Then click on My Identities.



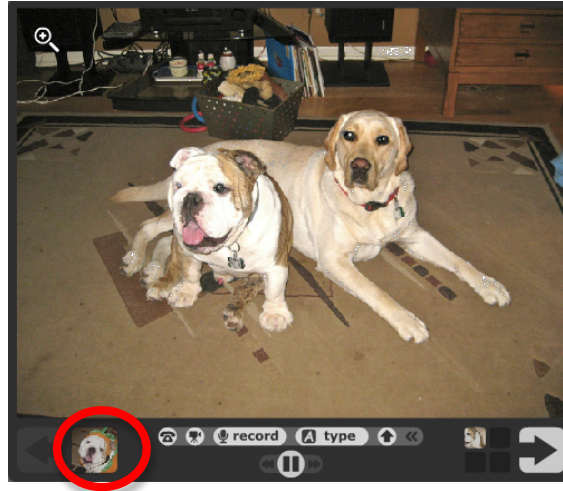
4. In the next window click on Add an Identity. Choose a nick name or use your student's first name, then either select an image to upload or use the image provided. Click Save and Close to create another Identity.



5. Click on Upload, VoiceThread gives you step-by-step instructions.

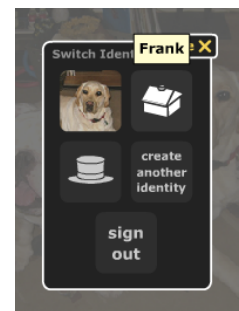


6. Click on Comments to add a comment. Be sure your Identity is chosen. To add more Identities or choose an Identity click on your picture on the bottom.



7. If a student forgets what their Identity picture looks like, roll over the pictures and the owner name of the Identity will appear.

8. When your VoiceThread is complete you will be asked to name it and give it a description. It will be saved in My Voice.



9. To Share your VoiceThread either click on Share in the Edit window or click on the wheel and select Share. You can Invite people to your VoiceThread, embed it into a website, get the link to share or share with groups or contacts.

10. Miscellaneous:

- You can only log into your VoiceThread account on one computer at a time. If you log in on another computer VoiceThread will automatically log you out on the other computer.
- You can embed your VoiceThread into your website. Others can view it but not comment.
