

## OTHER WORK EXPERIENCE OPPORTUNITIES

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### Work Experience in the Canadian Forces (Reserve)

- It is an off-campus program where students develop employability and workplace skills with the Canadian Forces (Reserve).
- The student must be at least 17 years of age.
- The student must be a member of the Canadian Forces (Reserve) before applying to participate in a Work Experience program.
- The student is required to complete a planned training program within a specified time frame
- A contract must be agreed to in advance by the school, the student, the parent/guardian and the Canadian Forces.
- The student and the school authority must meet all other Off-campus requirements as well as those defined in the special contract with the Canadian Forces
- The Off-campus coordinator is responsible for assessing the student and assigning a mark for the Work Experience course(s).

### Work Experience with the Cadet Corps

- It is an Off-campus program where students develop employability and workplace skills with the Cadet Corps.
- A student must be 15 years of age or older.
- The student is employed as a Staff Cadet at summer camp involved in instructional and/or supervisory duties.
- A contract must be agreed to in advance by the school, the student, the parent and the home Cadet Corps
- The student and the school authority must meet all other Off-campus requirements as well as those defined in the special contract with the Cadet Corps.
- The Off-campus coordinator is responsible for visiting the work site(s), assessing the student and assigning a mark for the Work Experience course(s).

### Health Care Aide

- It is an Off-campus program where students develop employability and workplace skills while earning a provincial certification as a Health Care Aide.
- A student is required to have completed or enrolled in ELA 10-1 or 10-2, Math 10-1, 10-2 or 10-4, Science 10 or 10-4, Social Studies 10-1 or 10-2, and CTR 1010.
- A student must have at least a 95% attendance record.
- A student may receive post-secondary credits transferable to further study in the health care field.

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### Oil & Gas Production Field Operator (PFO) Program

- It is a program which aims primarily to prepare future certified Production Field Operators, increase skill level for entry positions, enhance youth employability skills and increase awareness of post-secondary options.
- High School students are introduced to the oil and gas industry through a mix of educational training and hands-on learning.
- Starting in Grade 10, students can earn high school credits in CTS as well as Work Experience courses.
- Students gain field experience through four to five week paid internships with local employers.
- The PFO Program runs in Wabasca and in southeastern Alberta. In Wabasca, students can earn their high school diploma as well as certification from SAIT through Northern Lakes College. In southeastern Alberta, students attend the EnCana Energy Camp at SAIT polytechnic.

### Forestry Youth Education Initiative

- It is a partnership among Alberta Forest Products Association, University of Alberta, NAIT and CAREERS: the Next Generation.
- The program's intent is to increase awareness among high school youth of career opportunities in the forestry sector.
- It is a six week internship program for high school students and forestry employers in Grande Prairie, Peace River, High Level and LaCrete.
- Beginning in Grade 10, students may earn high school credits in CTS and Work Experience courses.
- Students also receive safety training through a summer camp and gain entry into the forestry industry while being paid.
