Exams

Congratulations to all Year 10/11 students who have now sat their exams. This was a great opportunity to practice a range of skills in exam conditions. This exam practice will not only give another opportunity for students to receive feedback, it will also better prepare students who will sit Year 12 VCAA exams. Senior School teachers and coordinators will also use the information provided by the exams to better prepare students in semester two.

Year 12's and any Year 11's completing a Year 12 subject will start their exam on Tuesday and the GAT will be held on Wednesday at 10am- 1:15pm. Students sitting the GAT should arrive at the hall foyer no later than 9:45 to ensure that the Exam starts on time.

Today, Project Rokit delivered sessions on Anti-Bullying and Social Labels and Judgement to all our Year 7-9 students. Rather than dealing with labels of 'bullies' and 'victims,' the Anti-Bullying session places an emphasis on the role of the bystander and the responsibility to stand up to bullying and be counted. Students participated in a range of role-plays and scenarios to help them develop the skills to stand up to bullying. The Social Labels and Judgement session discussed how we form judgements, what labels we place on others, and ourselves and how we can display empathy to others online and offline. It's about challenging the status quo and breaking down why we label groups or individuals.

On 19 June, we will have our Senior School Info Night for all Year 9 students and families. Come learn about the great programs happening in our Senior School including VET, VCAL and VCE. You will also be introduced to some of the classes you can take and you can begin thinking about your future pathways after secondary school!

Macpherson Smith Rural Foundation Rural Chances Scholarship

Who are these scholarships for?

RURAL CHANCES scholarships are for young rural Victorians who are facing significant financial or social challenges, who have career aspirations and want to/or are **studying at TAFE or undertaking an apprenticeship**.

To meet the eligibility criteria applicants will need to:

- Be 16-24 years of age
- Live in the western half of rural/regional Victoria – see map for eligible regions
- Hold a Centrelink health care card (personally or family)
- Identify a TAFE Certificate III or IV qualification they would like to enrol or are enrolled in OR be undertaking an apprenticeship
- Be planning to train in a skill area where there are skills shortages in rural/regional Victoria
- Be willing and excited to have a mentor supporting their learning
- Be willing to be accountable for the use of scholarship funds
- Be willing to participate in publicity/promotional material and research.

The Rural Chances pilot program is being launched for the second half of 2017. The online application process is simple, and requires you to submit either a **written application** or a **video application**.

What do you get with a Rural Chances scholarship?

In 2017, there are **5 scholarships valued up to \$5000** to assist young people to move away from their home town or to assist with extensive travel required to complete training qualifications. Rural Chances scholarship recipients will receive extra care from a **mentor and leadership and networking opportunities**.

Additionally, **smaller scholarships of up to \$2000 are available** for specific items to support training. These are funded from a \$25,000 pool, and applicants must identify what they need, how much it will cost and why they need it to complete their study. These smaller amounts can be used for equipment, course fees, tools of trade, travel costs, materials etc. Recipients will also be offered **mentoring and leadership and networking opportunities**.
