### Basic Citation:

1. Author's name (last name, first name) (period)
2. Title of the book (underlined and period)

(Use the title page and back of the title page as your first source of information.)

### Book by a single author

Kaku, Michio. Hyperspace.

### Article in an encyclopedia or dictionary (World Book, Webster's)

"Mandarin." The Encyclopedia Americana. 2000 ed.

## INTERNET

### Basic Citation:

1. Author's name (if given) (period)
2. Title of the project, database, professional, or personal site (if given) (underlined) (period)
3. Electronic address (beginning through .com) (in angle brackets) (period)

### Example:

Bursztajn, Harold J., and Archie Brodsky. Forensic Psychiatry & Medicine.

## ONLINE SUBSCRIPTION DATABASES

### Basic Citation:

1. Author's name (if given) (period)
2. Name of database (underlined) (period)
3. Electronic access (beginning through .com) (URL, if known, in angle brackets) (period)
