- Admission to Student Teaching - a) Satisfactory accomplishment of content-area, standard-driven assessments, b) “B-” or better in Instructional Strategies, Assessment, and Management courses, c) “B-” or better in all practicum courses, d) 2.5 GPA (overall, WSU and content) and e) Completed application packet with yearly negative TB test.
- Exit from Student Teaching - a) “B-” or better in student teaching and content methods II (CI 455), b) 2.5 GPA (overall and WSU), c) Successful completion of all degree requirements, d) Final Student Teaching Supervisor Evaluation Form.
- Degree Completion – a) 2.5 GPA (overall and WSU), and b) Meets all degree requirements
- Licensure Recommendation – a) Passes common assessments, b) Passing score on Kansas Performance Teaching Portfolio, c) PLT passed, d) Praxis II content test(s) passed, and e) Licensure application
