


Making Your Outline

1. First, log in and click on your list. Now, click on the “Notecards” screen:

2. All of your notecards will be in this little box. Drag them out onto your tabletop. If you want, you can put them into “piles” to organize your paragraphs.

3. Now, click twice on the first Roman numeral in your outline to rename it “Introduction.”

5. Now, drag notecards that will go in that paragraph on top of the paragraph title. It will then appear as a subtopic and a checkmark will appear on the notecard so you know you've already used it.
