Santa Rosa Island has an extent of about 55000 acres and is a very valuable island for stock growing purposes. There are said to be on the island more than 50000 sheep, and a number of thousand of Horses mules and cattle.

On the west end of the island are shifting sands to a small extent the greater portion of the the Island however seems to be covered with plains and stretches of level country, where there grow abundances of Wild Oaks, and other grasses. Numerous canyons run from the coast of the island into the interior in some of these are a considerable number of Live Oaks and shrubs. a considerable amount of low brush also grows on some of the steep hillsides. My collections were made from the Northeast side of the island from one of the best watered and timbered
