Sitomys ————— Abundant everywhere
this species seems to be to a great
extent a cave dweller many
thousand of caves of more or less extent
were found about the island

Urocyon littoralis Not so common
as on Santa Rosa I am informed
that they are trapped to a
considerable extent for their fur

Spilogale ————— Surely not
very common in the part of the
island where I collected I caught
one specimen only, saw no tracks
of any in the sand or caves
where there were a good many
foxes tracks

Bats One small one was seen
to make a few circles during several
successive nights near our camp I examined
scores of caves but found none

or any signs except in one cave
which was almost inaccessible
in this I found as much as a
basket of dung which I have no
doubt was that made by bats
it was about the size made by Neotoma
and was composed of the remains of
insects

Phoca vitulina

Several rookeries
of a considerable extent still in
existence they live in very
extensive caves in many places and
where the seals have difficulty in
seeing them
