Eurasia Group Corporate Advisory Board Memorandum, May 10, 1999: "A showdown is expected in Moscow this week with the new impeachment proceedings against President Yeltsin scheduled to begin May 15. While a compromise was reached last month with an agreement to postpone the proceedings, there have been no signs of conciliatory statements this time around. President Yeltsin is likely to sack Prime Minister Primakov this week before the hearings begin Sergei Stepashin, the newly-appointed First Deputy Prime Minister seems to be Yeltsin's first choice to force Primakov into retirement. The growth of support around Stepashin since his recent appointment has added plausibility to his positive responses from varied sources - Stepashin's St. Petersburg base, some center-nationalist quarters in the Duma and Federation Council and Mayor of Moscow Yuri Luzhkov. Stepashin also maintains a significant base of support in the Ministry of the Interior as well as Justice (his previous appointment), both of which provide him with more leverage than other candidates in getting through a Duma vote."

The New York Times, May 13, 1999: "Ever the gambler, President Boris N. Yeltsin abruptly fired Prime Minister Yevgeny M. Primakov Wednesday, pushing Russia to the brink of a new political crisis ♦ To replace Primakov ♦ Yeltsin Wednesday named Interior Minister Sergei V. Stepashin, 47, a Yeltsin loyalist"

Eurasia Group Corporate Advisory Memorandum, October 26, 1998: "We have

received indications from Moscow that Deputy Foreign Minister Yuri Ushakov will replace Yuli Vorontsov as Russian Ambassador to the United States this December. The appointment of Ushakov, who has a low profile in the Foreign Ministry, would be a signal from the Primakov administration that relations between Moscow and Washington are cooling."

The New York Times, January 20, 1999: "Russia new Ambassador to the United States, Yuri Ushakov, formally took up his post and will present his credentials to President Clinton on Friday. Mr. Ushakov, 51, who is a career diplomat, replaces Yuli Vorontsov, who is retiring at 69."
