Cancer Deaths

19 Silwod Avenue - Young mother died cancer, leaving 2 small children – foundations of home collapsed – and refuse from tip was found when foundations had to be dug deeper down. –

Family – daughter died brain tumour – father died cancer

Next door neighbour to above family died breast cancer

Another lady died cancer close to 19 Silwood Avenue.

Well known Hobart Real Estate agent died leukaemia beach end of Silwood Avenue.

Above homes were on the lower side of street adjoining landfill and all early residents

Mr. Goodwin who sold part of the original lagoon to the Council died of cancer – lived close to tip on old Rokeby Road.(now Clarence Street)

Two of the men who built No 23 Salacia Avenue came across rubbish from the tip when digging the foundations – one died cancer, the other died leukaemia. Non - residents

Allumba Street - young man died leukaemia played football WP – his father used to watch him – said he was often covered in black oily substance.
