The Lord's name be praised.

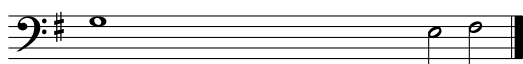

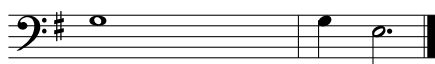
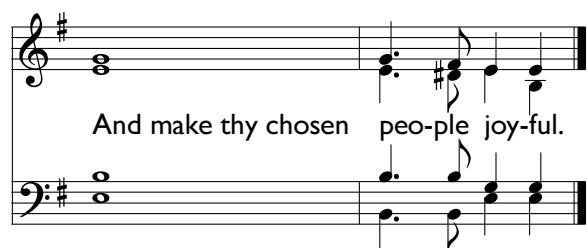
O Lord, shew thy mercy up-on us.



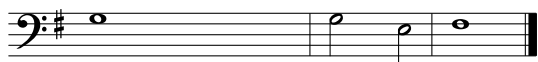
O Lord, save the Queen.



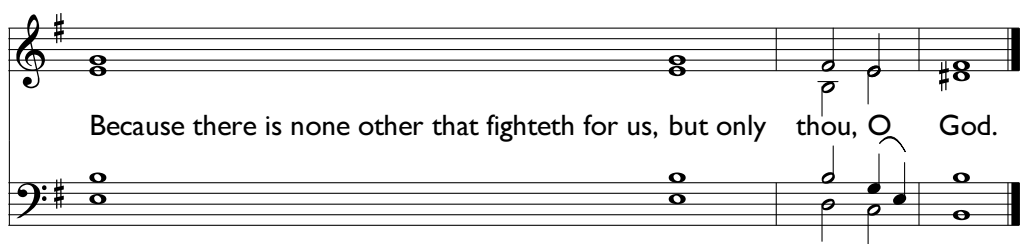
Endue thy ministers with right-eous-ness.
