Ernest Walker was born in Bombay. He was an undergraduate at Balliol College, Oxford and he became Organist and Director of Music there in 1901, having taken the Oxford D.Mus. in 1898. This beautiful anthem was dedicated to Sir Walter Parratt and was published by Novello in 1947. Originally written for ATB only (men's voices), it is arranged here for SATB so that it can be used more widely; it is transposed from the original key of D and the extra voice parts and doublings are not intended to be a slavish transcription of Walker's original.
