Thank you, Honey! You're an excellent cook!




Here's some more for you, Grandpa!

Now, that wasn't a loving thing that Claire did, was it? Claire had the doll behind her back!


PAUSE!

No, Grandpa. The girl was telling a lie to her little sister!


Yes. It's a terrible thing to tell lies to try to cover up wrong-doing! The Lord is against lying. He hates it! Who knows a verse about lying?




I do, Grandpa. "I hate and abhor lying: but Thy Law do I love."  
(Psa.119:163)




And, "Speak every man the truth to his neighbour."  
(Zech.8:16)




Grandpa, today I learned a lesson about telling the truth, and I learned the verse, "Lie not one to another."

--That even when he does speak the truth, no one believes him!




Like the story of "Wolf! Wolf!" When the wolf really came, nobody believed the little shepherd boy, because he had told so many lies before!




Help! Wolf! Wolf!



That's right!

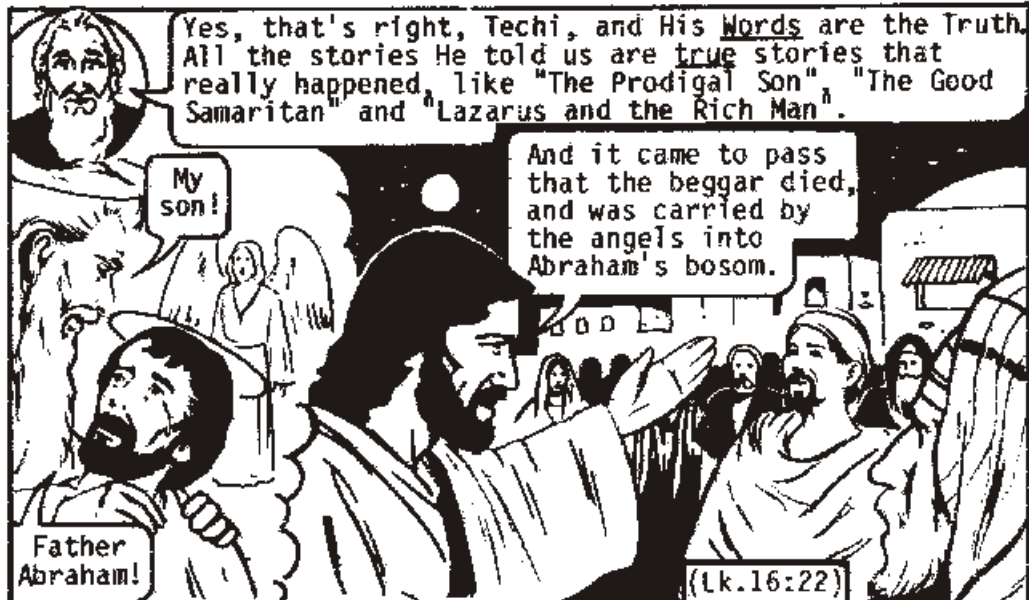



You see, it's not good to say things to try to deceive people, because sooner or later your sin will find you out!

Jesus said, "I am the Way, the Truth and the Life!" (Jn.14:6)




