When you are fishing, surrounded by the beauty of the river, you realize that you are alone and that the only living things around and you are trout, grayling etc....

I've been fly fishing for many years, practically since I was a child and this discipline is more a mental state than a physical one.

I was born in a little village in the Marche region where the Cesano stream flows and that is exactly where I started fly fishing.

It is my duty to thank the first person who made me fall in love with fishing, my father Domenico.

He is one of the unknown masters of fly fishing and his addiction soon spread to me.

I remember that we always went fishing together and in those moments we stopped being father and son and became two friends.

He left me the love for fishing, the knowledge of rivers and trout.

All this has driven me to vast studies and experiments (which have lasted years), especially the making of silk lines with which I have practically always and only fished.
