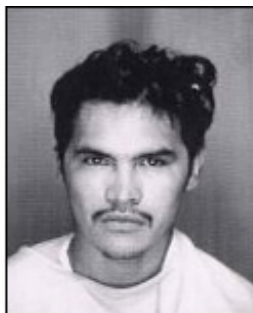

September 20, 2010

On August 21, 2010, at approximately 3:50 a.m., the Rantoul Police Department responded to a report of gunshots in the area of Par Drive and Willow Pond Road in Rantoul.

Upon arrival, officers located a 29 year old male with a gunshot wound to his leg. Officers learned that the subject was walking to a residence in the area when four to five gunshots were fired and he was struck by a bullet. The victim was transported to the hospital and released after treatment.

The victim was unable to describe his attackers and did not know where the shots were fired from.

On August 31, 2010, at 10:45 p.m., officers were once again dispatched to the area of Par Drive and Willow Pond Road for a report of gunshots in the area.

Upon arrival, officers located four (4) vehicles and two (2) residences that had been struck by bullets. An additional vehicle was later discovered to have been struck by gunfire as it was leaving the area. No injuries were reported in this incident.

Analysis of the crime scene shows that multiple shots were fired from both the north and south sides of Par Drive. Multiple witnesses have been interviewed, but no one has yet identified who the suspect(s) are in this case.

The Rantoul Police Department is seeking information on both of these shootings and believes that they may be linked. Anyone with information on one, or both, of these crimes is asked to call the Rantoul Police Department or Crime Stoppers with the information.
