

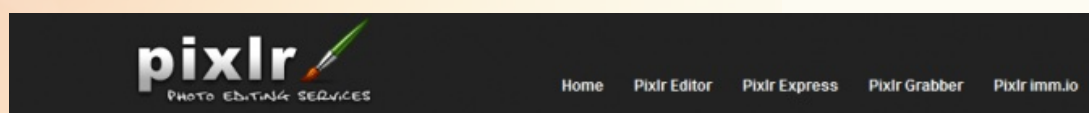

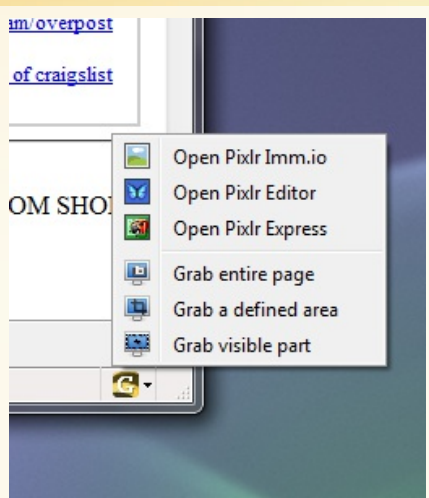

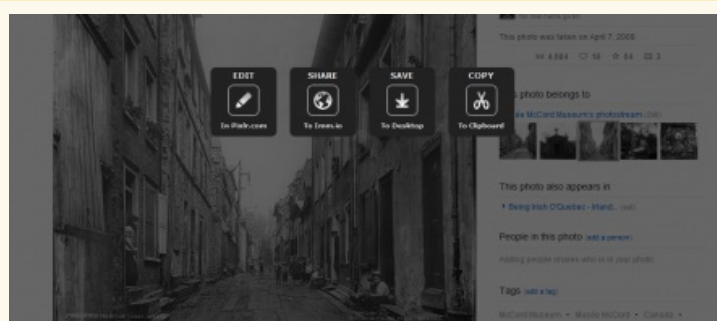

Ever known someone with a photographic memory? Me neither. Unless you count the fictional Lisbeth Salander, and I'm okay with that. But even if you have an out-of-site memory that lets you page through content, I bet cropping is a complication...never mind sharing your myelin-sheathed slideshow on Facebook or Twitter. That's exactly why there are add-ons like **Pixlr Grabber**.

After installing Pixlr Grabber, find the icon in the bottom right of your browser. It looks like a big "G". Click for a menu:

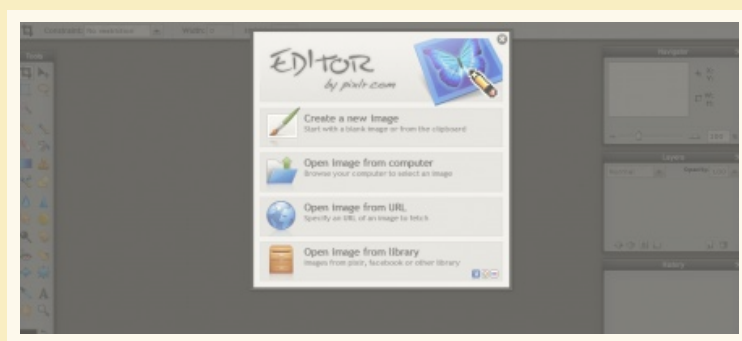

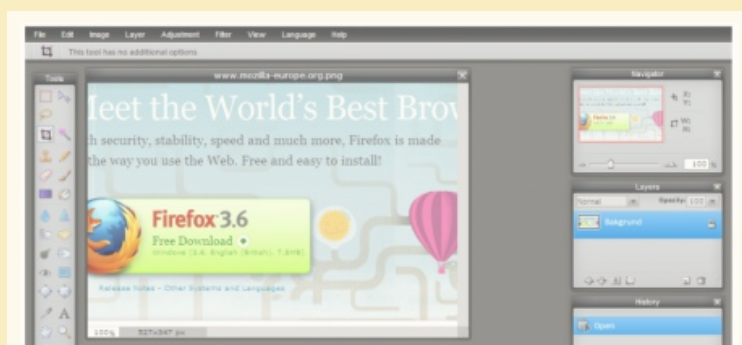
