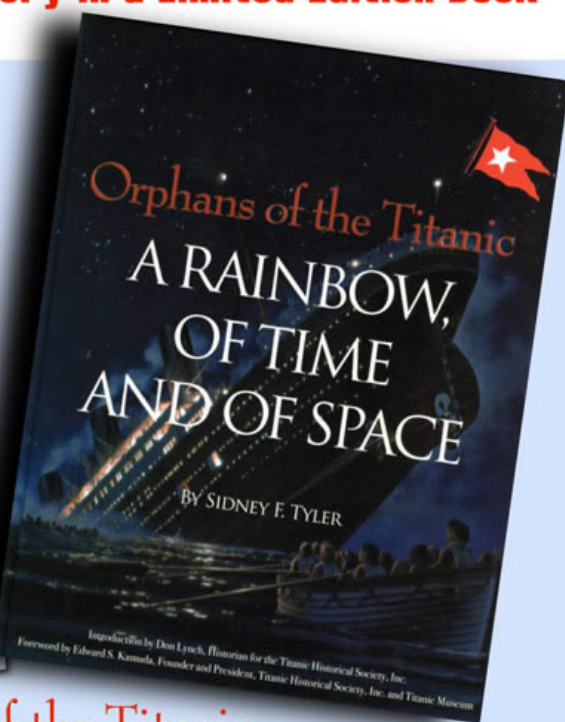
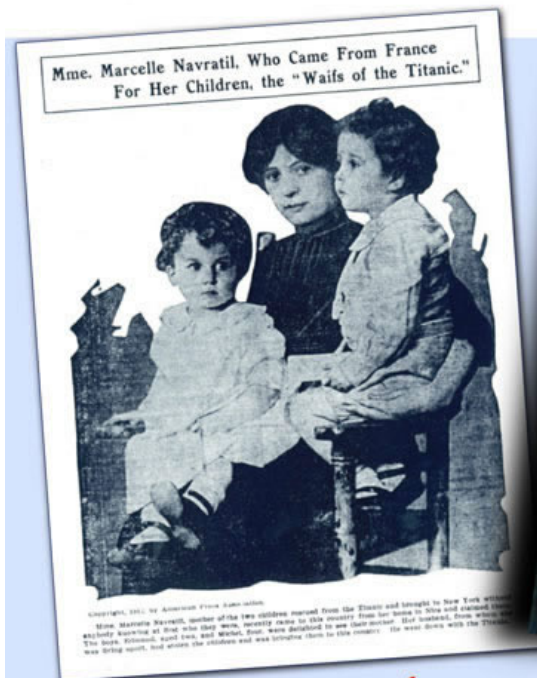

Orphans of the Titanic

For nearly a century the *Titanic* has been a source of fascination and, although many books have been written about the ill-fated White Star liner, the real story is the effect it had on the people involved. In May 1912, for two memorable weeks, five-year-old Sidney Tyler enjoyed the company of Lolo and Momon, four and two-year old French boys saved from the sinking *Titanic*. As years passed, Sidney never forgot their visit to his home and he wondered what happened to his childhood friends.

Published by the Titanic Historical Society to honor *Titanic's* centennial, *Orphans of the Titanic* is a sensitive tale of happenstance that brought two French children into the home of a Philadelphia boy—and of his determination to renew—almost 70 years later, a friendship that began from a terrible tragedy—the *Titanic* disaster.

With *Titanic's* centennial upon us, there are no survivors left to describe their personal experiences that could add a new dimension to that awful night of April 14-15 1912. RMS TITANIC – A Day to Remember

Second of a trio, Titanic was one of the most elegant ocean liners built during the "golden era" of sea travel. Her brief builders' trials took place on April 2, 1912 with tugs arriving around 6 am to ease Titanic out to a point in Belfast Lough where the massive liner could proceed under her own power for the first time. She then underwent rigorous tests within the enclosed waters of the Lough until, in the early afternoon, she proceeded into the open Irish Sea for running trials. Steaming south for two hours brought her within view of the Mourne Mountains and St. John's Point lighthouse, County Down. Here Titanic carried out a broad 180-degree turn before heading back to Belfast to receive her Board of Trade passenger certificate, "... good for one year from today, 2-4-12" and handing her over to her owners. Around 8 pm, the liner left for Southampton and, in darkness, bade farewell to the coastline she would never see again.

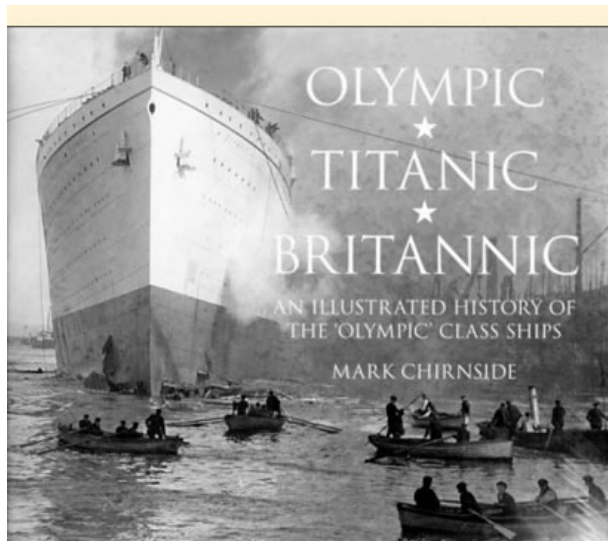

Competition between the major shipping lines was fierce at the beginning of the twentieth century. Britain responded to the commercial threat by the growing German merchant marine and there was also rivalry between the Cunard Line and its chief competitor, the White Star Line. Against this backdrop, Olympic, Titanic and Britannic were conceived. Designed for passenger comfort, they were intended for luxurious surroundings and safe, reliable service rather than record-breaking speed. In the end, Fate decreed that only Olympic would ever complete a single commercial voyage and she went

on to serve for a quarter of a century in peace and in war. Titanic's name would become infamous when she sank on her maiden voyage. Britannic saw a brief and commendable career as a hospital ship during the First World War, sinking in the Aegean Sea in 1916.

Mark Chirnside tells the sister ship's stories by way of previously unseen pictures, passenger diaries and deck plans. With a focus on the human histories of those who traveled and worked on the ships, this beautifully illustrated book details Olympic's successful career and the premature ends of her two unfortunate sisters.

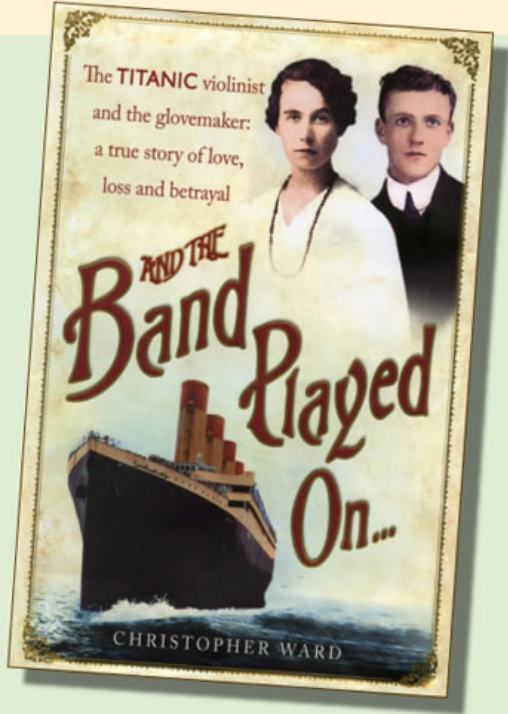

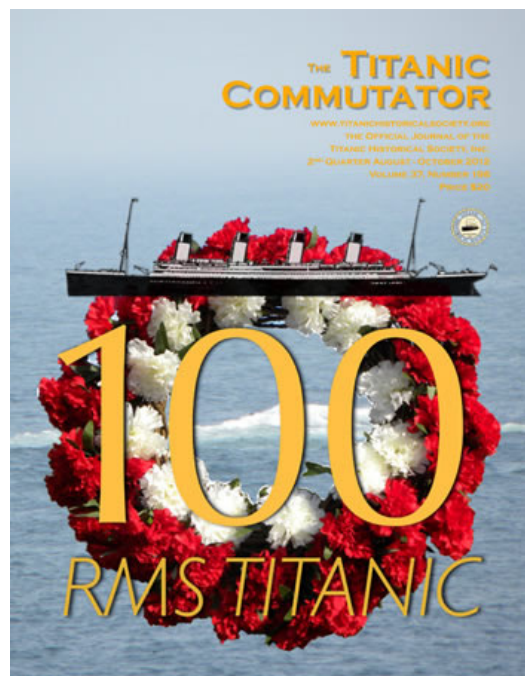

The Latest Titanic Commutator (No. 198) is Here! 49 Years of Continuous Publication



Here we at 100 for *RMS Titanic*! This year has been both busy and exciting; there are Titanic centenary commemorations happening all over the world—*Titanic*'s story endures. In keeping with the theme, the articles in this issue are all Titanic-related, some with different twists.

Author Patrick Stenson re-examines the timing in *Titanic Meets Iceberg*. Did the collision really happen in that way through those critical moments immediately before the accident? In part it undoubtedly did but a re-evaluation of the evidence after the passing of a century (during which time it's always been there for everyone to see) strongly lays claim to one very distinct and vital difference to shed a significant new light on the circumstances leading up to the instant when the ice was struck.

One of the few first class passengers from the *Titanic* about whom almost nothing has been written is Gertrude Wayne, later Mrs. Richard C. Yanke. Don Lynch uncovered much new information. Traveling under the name Thorne she would have been nearly impossible to track down but for two clues she left behind. It is probably through Ethel Levey and her connection with the theater that Gertrude first met George Rosenshine. George's grand-niece, the late Janet S. Ripin, recalled that he and his brothers were friends of theatrical producer Henry B. Harris. George M. Cohan was a good friend of Harris, and perhaps Harris and Cohan introduced George and Gertrude. They planned to complete their world tour with another maiden voyage—that of the *Titanic*.

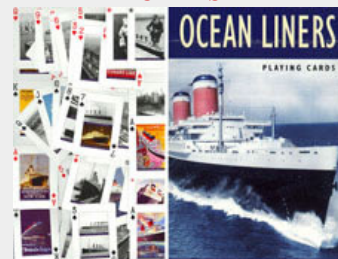

It is impossible to do that but excerpts inside from a little book titled "A Day in a Shipyard." is as good as it gets. The text is a virtual guided tour written especially for young adults. Published in 1910 and reprinted in 1931, mechanical and technical jargon is omitted and descriptions are easily understood. The shipyard and ship is not named but it is obvious the yard is Harland & Wolff and the ship described is *Olympic*. In this issue we will concentrate on her keel and riveting.

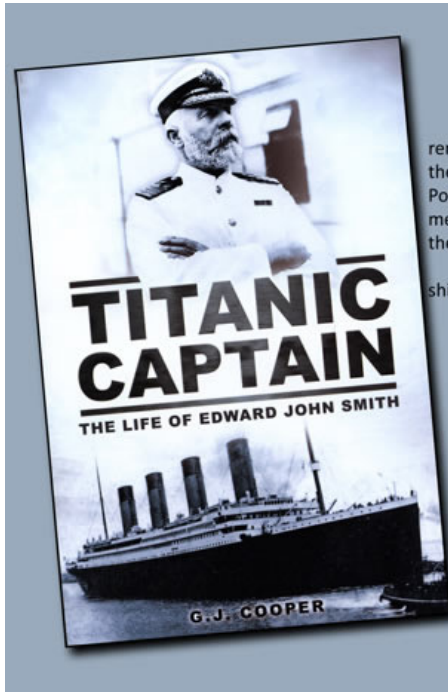


POLAR **THE TITANIC BEAR** By Daisy Corning Stone Spedden

TITANIC CAPTAIN THE LIFE OF EDWARD JOHN SMITH

Back in print, this popular biography of Commander Edward John Smith is a remarkable example of how a man from a humble background could get far in the world. Born to a working-class family in the land-locked Staffordshire Potteries, he went to sea at seventeen and rose rapidly through the ranks of the merchant navy, serving first in sailing vessels and later in the new steamships of the White Star Line.

By 1912, he was White Star's senior commander and regarded by many in the shipping world as the "millionaire's captain." After being master on the brand

new RMS *Olympic*, Smith was given command of White Star's latest ocean liner, RMS *Titanic*, for her maiden voyage. What should have been among the crowning moments of a long and successful career at sea rapidly turned into a nightmare when *Titanic* struck and iceberg and in a matter of hours took around 1,500 lives with her including Captain Smith.

G. J. Cooper has been tracing the career of E. J. Smith since 1987. This extensively researched biography is packed full of insight and detail into the life of this legendary captain. Softcover, 256 pages, illustrated.

This is the final issue for 2011 and our readers have a wonderful variety of articles to choose from. The featured story is about a famous building still in London under another name—however a century ago without a doubt, Oceanic House was a landmark and will always be associated with one man and two steamships. J. Bruce Ismay, as President of the IMMCo and Chairman and Managing Director of White Star, was instrumental in acquiring the site for the combined companies in the centre of London. Following his late father and the design and construction of 30 James Street, at the height of the Victorian era, the son wished to mark his tenure at the head of White Star and IMMCo with an equally impressive structure. Always in the shadow of his father, Oceanic House, with its exuberance of decoration, was a design Thomas Ismay would probably have disapproved of; nevertheless it symbolized his son's determination in an age of excess in ornamentation to make a lasting impression. Oceanic House, the name chosen for the West End offices would represent not just White Star as the leading line in the combine but all the IMMCo companies including Holland-America. Paul Loudon-Brown chronicles the building's fascinating story.

While history has given prominence to coverage of the *Titanic* disaster by male reporters Carlos Hurd (*New York Evening World/St. Louis Post-Dispatch*), Jim Speers (*New York Times*) and Jack Binns (*New York American*), editors Charles E. Chapin (*New York Evening World*) Carr Van Anda (*New York Times*), and Ogden M. Reid (*New York Tribune*), and publishers Ralph Pulitzer (*New York World*), Adolph Ochs (*New York Times*), James Gordon Bennett Jr. (*New York Herald*), and William

Randolph Hearst (*New York Journal*), extraordinary reporting of the 'story of the century' was also provided by four newspaperwomen: Americans May R. Birkhead and Katherine C. Hurd, and Canadians Mary Dawson Snider and Betty Thornley. Michael Dupuis brings their stories to life.

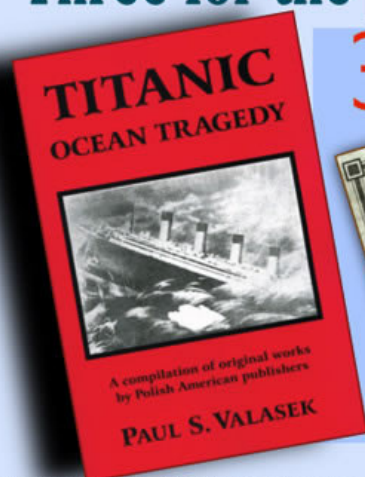

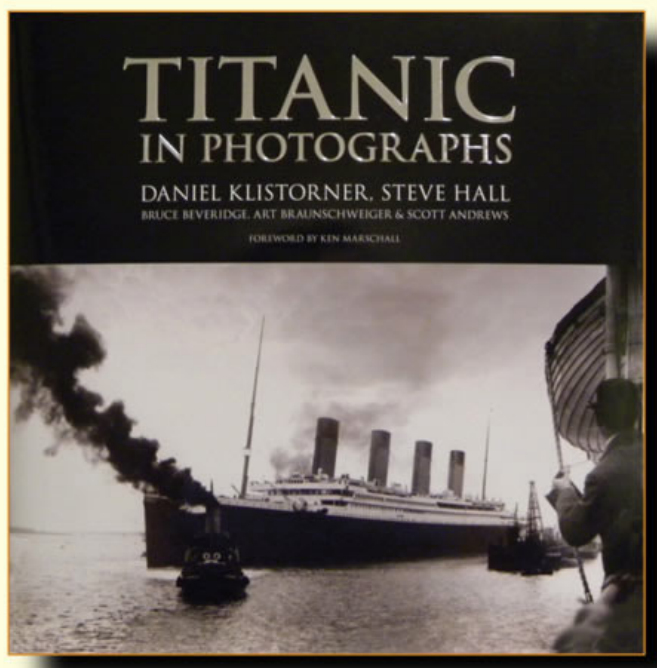

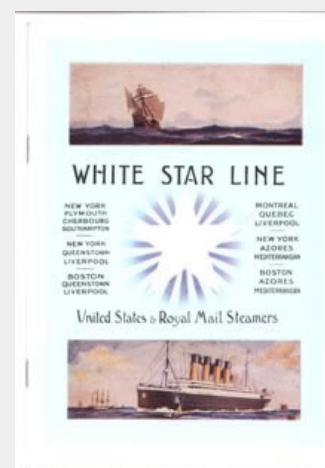

A Biography
of the
Titanic's
Rescue Ship

On April 15, 1912, *Titanic* sank in the North Atlantic taking over 1,500 souls with her. The death toll would have been higher if it had not been the quick actions taken by Capt. Rostron of the Cunarder *Carpathia* and, as a result, 705 were saved. The author has written over a dozen works of history and his latest is the story of that fateful night plus a complete biography of her career from construction, her service as an immigrant ship, an early cruise ship to a trooper in World War One and her sinking from a torpedo on July 17, 1918 off the coast of Ireland. BRUNEL'S GREAT SHIPS

Isambard Kingdom Brunel was a leading British civil engineer famed for his bridges, dockyards, and for the construction of the first major British railway, the Great Western Railway. He is remembered for a series of famous steamships and his designs revolutionized public transportation and modern engineering. The *Great Western* was the longest ship in the world at 236 ft when it was built. In addition to her steam-powered paddle wheels, the wooden ship carried four masts for sails and embarked on her maiden voyage from Avonmouth, Bristol, to New York on 8 April 1838. Brunel had become convinced of the superiority of propeller-driven ships over paddle wheels. After tests, he incorporated a large six-bladed propeller into his design for the 322-foot *Great Britain*, launched in 1843. *Great Britain* is considered the first modern ship—being built of metal and driven by propeller rather than paddle wheel. She was the first iron-hulled, propeller-driven ship to cross the Atlantic Ocean. The *Great Eastern* was an iron sailing steamship designed by Brunel. She was by far the largest ship ever built at the time of her 1858 launch, and had the capacity to carry 4,000 passengers around the world without refuelling. Running time 38 minutes. 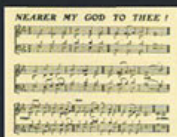
