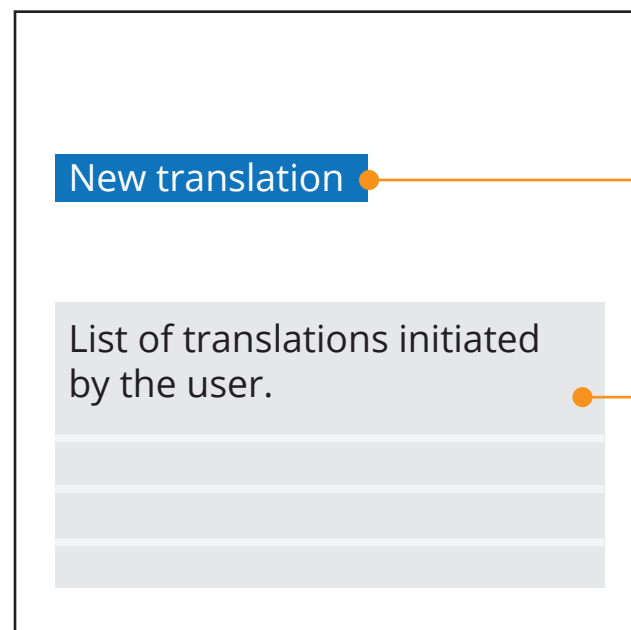


# Content translation

Designs for a minimal viable product

“Create a new article for the X wikipedia based on an article on the Y Wikipedia”

## Translation center



The user initiates a new translation or continue the translations she initiated before.

## Additional entry points

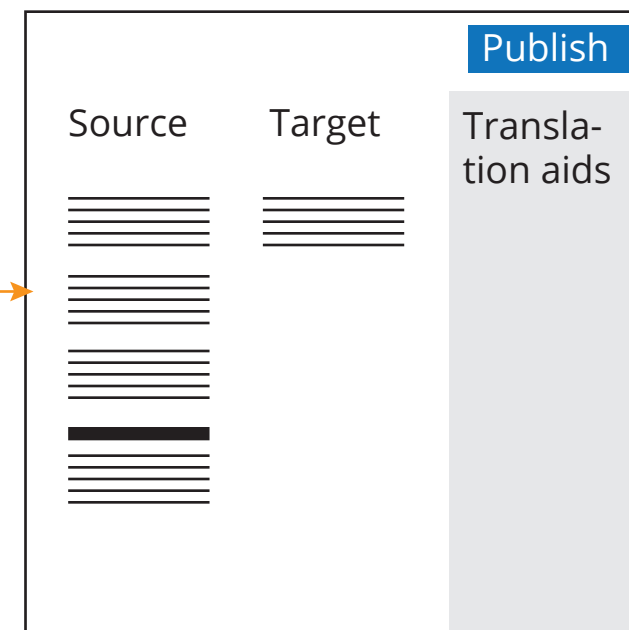
When creating a new article, or a translation-related template is presented to the user, users should be able to directly initiate a translation.

## New translation



The user selects the article to translate and the languages to translate from/to.

## Translate view



The user translates some of the article paragraphs with the help of several translation aids.

## Article published



Once published, the content becomes a regular article, and the user is welcomed to further edit it to adjust styling and add content.

# Traffic light

Traffic lights, also known as traffic [signals](#), traffic lamps, signal lights, stop lights and robots,<sup>[1]</sup> and also known technically as traffic control signals<sup>[2]</sup> are signalling devices positioned at road intersections, pedestrian crossings and other locations to control competing flows of traffic. Traffic lights were first installed in 1868 in London<sup>[3]</sup> and are now used all over the world.

Traffic lights alternate the right of way accorded to road users by displaying lights of a standard color (red, orange/amber, and green) following a universal color code. In the typical sequence of color phases:

the green light allows traffic to proceed in the direction denoted, if it is safe to do so  
the yellow/amber light denoting prepare to stop short of the intersection, if it is safe to do so  
the red signal prohibits any traffic from proceeding
