Sunday 5th June
Left Concordia en route
for Richardson river
camped at Tommy
creek saw pair of Yellow
gullwing parrot fly
past camp at dusk
Saw many junco birds
along the track,
Red breasted Kingfisher
Pallid flycatcher
Yellow Linnet Tree
Sitt Black faced wood
swallow Light Brown
hawk Whistling Eagle
Hawks were the only ones
sighted.

Country passed through
Red sandy soil, stony
country, Black soil plain
Timber, Blood wood,
Mountain gum, River
Gum, Witch-hazel, Silver
Red Sycamore

Monday 6th

Went to go about
5 miles each along the road for
my horses. They must have been
frightened by coyotes. There was
about 100 of these brutes camped
about here. Left camp about 10 AM
& went on to the Borrego river 10
miles further on. Heard Robin
Pallid Flycatcher, Chipping Sparrow,
Marsh Wren, Flamingo, American
Sparrow, Bobble, Yucatan
Grackle, melanurus noted along
the road. Had some dinner when
I reached the river then went
up the river. Shot a pair of
Macgillivray parrots near the
crossing. Found a hawk's nest
with half fledged young one
in Paper bark tree.

Whistling crane, Kite Sulphur
crested Goshawk, Galapagos
Warbler, Kingbird, Tanager, Kingbird
Flavescens, P. melanoleucus.

Glycyphila, Truncatus melanop
gallina Black & White flycatcher
Ruffed Grouse, noted along
river, saw a Gray falcon flying
partly returning to camp
Some of the Titmice in bloom
a few Bloodweeds in bloom
on the river flat

Saw a Jabiru at a water hole
near camp

Maculirostris parrot. Male
beak normal eyes dark
brown bill bluish white
legs light lead color stomach
vent red, rump red, sides red

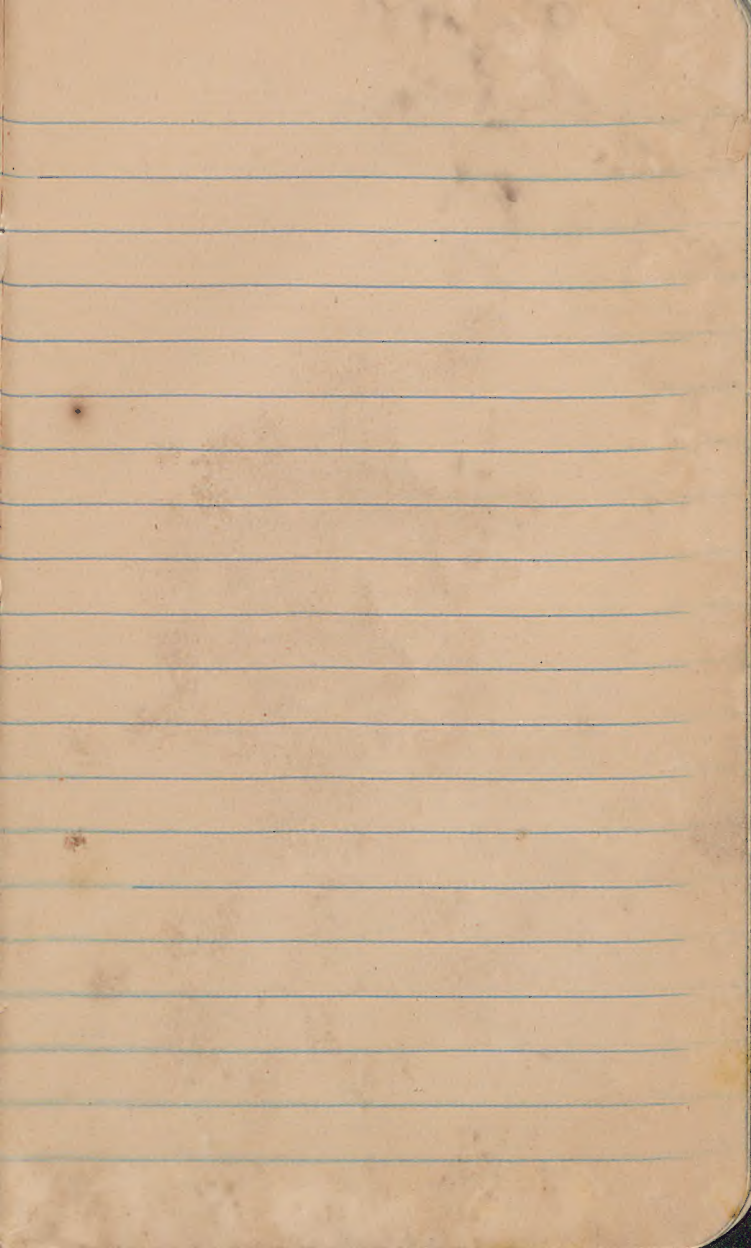
