NOVEMBER TRADE IN LIVESTOCK, PROCURE MEAT, AND MEAT PRODUCTS

U.S. trade in livestock, meat, and meat products set new value records in November. Exports at \$104 million and imports at \$168 million were up 14 and 4 percent, respectively, from the previous month's high. Increases in live cattle trade contributed most to the gains. Nearly 25,000 head of cattle were exported in November, the highest monthly total since January 1971. About 85 percent of the total was fat slaughter cattle destined for the Canadian hotel and restaurant trade. On the other side, imports of feeder cattle continued their seasonal upturn. Entries totaling 206,000 head were primarily from Mexico, but about 20 percent of the total came from Canada.

Exports

Animal fat exports were also up significantly due to larger shipments of lard to the United Kingdom and tallow to India.

Lard exports totaling 32 million pounds were the highest since November 1971. Almost 28 million pounds of the total were exported to the United Kingdom. Since early 1969, the United States has maintained an export subsidy on lard shipments to the United Kingdom to meet EC subsidized competition in that market. The rate was originally 2 cents per pound but was lowered to 1 cent in August 1969. It remained at that level through January 11, 1972, when the U.S. program was terminated.

Inedible tallow exports totaled slightly under 230 million pounds in November—up 7 percent from a year ago. Shipments of 32 million pounds to India accounted for the increase. The United States did not export any tallow to that country in November 1971.

India's sporadic purchases of U.S. tallow in 1972 have resulted in exports totaling only about 80 million pounds through November compared with 303 million in the same period of 1971.

Edible tallow exports were at the highest level of recent years. The 9 million pounds exported in November compares with annual exports of 10 million pounds in 1971, 20 million in 1970, and 13 million in 1969. Of the November total about 8 million pounds was shipped to India.

Cattle hide exports for the month were unchanged from last November's total of 1.7 million pieces, but continued their upward trend in value to average \$21.76 per piece—26 percent above October and more than 2.5 times last November's per unit export value.

Imports

Boneless beef imports of 112 million pounds in November helped bring the 11-month total up 25 percent from last year to 1,165 million pounds. Australia supplies more than half of U.S. boneless beef imports. Entries from this country were up 42 percent in the 11-month period to 609 million pounds.

Wool import prices increased in November but the volumes imported, while significantly higher than last year, were about equal to trends of the last few months. Dutiable or apparel imports averaged \$1.02 per pound compared with 88 cents per pound the previous month and 50 cents per pound a year ago. Per unit values of duty free wools averaged 78 cents per pound—6 cents above October and 38 cents above November 1971.
