MOVE TO TURNER HOSTEL



The S.R.C. with the rest of the student body welcomes the proposed move to Turner Hostel. At the recent Annual General Meeting the Principal pointed to the following advantages likely to follow from the move:

- Expanded library space with additional reading rooms
- The use of the main hall of the Hostel in its present state (this has floor space the size of the Albert Hall)
- Provision of dining room facilities and cafeteria service.

The new accommodation will allow the College to spread its wings and expand its activities to include dances, film evenings, table tennis and other indoor sports.

THE NEW HALL OF RESIDENCE

The Principal of the College has advised that plans are afoot to provide residential accommodation at the new College premises. It is proposed to accommodate up to 30 male students in accommodation roughly comparable with that in Government hostels, with, however, the following improvements: provision of study accommodation, one study to be shared between 2 residents; superior catering; and other amenities. The tariff will be comparable with and if possible lower than that at present charged at Government hostels. The nearness to lectures, the library, tutoring staff etc., and the opportunity to engage in collegiate life, is clearly a distinct advantage over ordinary hostel accommodation.



In order to assist the College in its plans for this new accommodation, students who would be interested in moving to Turner Hostel are asked to obtain and fill in one of the forms available in the Library.

GENERAL MEETING: All students are urged to attend the special General Meeting of the Students Association to be held in Room A, Census Building, at 9 p.m. on Wednesday, 20th May, 1953. This meeting has been called to discuss a proposed amendment to the Constitution concerning S.R.C. fees. Full details of the proposed amendment are posted on the College Notice Board.
