Slavery in the Territories. This question has been the perplexing one for the last ten years.

The position of the Democratic party on this subject has been well understood by all who feel interest in the subject to inquire into it.

Terrestrial are incipient States, composed of people accustomed to independence in their local legislation.

In 1845, General Cass wrote his famous Nicholas letter. Previous to its appearance, there had been made to prohibit slavery in all territories.

No Democratic platform asserted that a territorial legislature had no power to prohibit slavery.

It is true that most of the Southern Democrats, perhaps, held that neither Congress nor a territorial legislature had power to prohibit slavery.

There is a great rolling up of eyes now at "quicker sovereignty," which claims that the power over slavery resides in the territorial legislature.

General Cass, the premier of the present administration held it, Mr. Buchanan held it, and proclaimed it in the letter accepting his nomination.

Do not let us be misled by the opinion which we have reversed; and it secures to property in slaves in the territory the protection that other property will have.

What is the remedy for this? That the whole party, and do not pass a law that Congress shall furnish a code of laws for self-protection of slaves.

CONGRESS meets on the sixth of December, and ends its session on the fourth of March next.

Up to Saturday the receipts were large, amounting from Tuesday to that day, inclusive, 50,000 head, but the supplies have been small, comprising only 12,000 head. This sudden falling off in arrivals fanned the excitement into a flame, and good hogs were sought after last evening with an eagerness that indicated a feeling of extraordinary confidence on the part of buyers.

The week was large, reaching 50,000 head, the most of which were for future delivery, and including 10,000 head, which were sold yesterday, averaging 200 lbs. delivering the first two weeks of January, at \$6.75. The seller of this lot, we understand, is a regular dealer who does a large business in shipping hogs East, and he is reported as having the animals in Indiana and Illinois. This is probably the largest sale on record in this market, the transaction amounting to over \$300,000. Ten thousand dollars was deposited with each party to the bargain. We quote the closing rates for present delivery, as follows:

Hogs averaging 100 to 200 lbs. \$6.25 to 6.75. Hogs averaging 200 to 300 lbs. \$6.50 to 7.00. Late in the evening 300 head, averaging 240 lbs., sold at \$5.75; and 120 do, averaging 250 lbs. at \$5.75. In most cases holders were selling 20 to 25 lbs. fat, and fattened animals, averaging 330 to 340 lbs.

From the Illinoisian, Marshall, Ill.:

Meers Lion & Reed of this place are giving from \$4.75 to \$5.75 net for pork.

They have slaughtered from 1,500 to 1,600 at the above prices.

From the St. Louis Democrat of November 30:

The weather is too warm for packing, and few only are offering. Only one slaughter house was going today. Holders are firm at \$4.75 to \$5.75 net for pork.

A few were killed yesterday at the first figures, but no sale was reported this morning.

The Chicago papers represent the demand as very quiet for light hogs, of which there is a surplus, and a better one for good heavy at \$4.55 to \$4.75 gross. The Tribune says:

The accounts we receive from all parts of Illinois and Iowa are to the effect that owing to the shortness of the corn crop, farmers are sending their hogs to market not half fat.

We saw a reliable trader who has been through Peoria and LaSalle counties in this State within the past week, and he assures us that the corn crop is much shorter than usual. He says that the hogs are being sent to market in large numbers, and that the condition of the hogs which are arriving here—for never before were there such an array of thin looking animals as to this market to be killed.

LANOR HOOP.—A friend informs us that Mr. Larkin Darnon, of near Clintonville, in this county, sold 33 hogs, averaging weight, 370 lbs. each, for \$2,000.00, or \$5.75 per head. Wm. Whitley, of the same place sold 50 head, averaging 350 lbs., for \$2,875.00, or \$5.75 per head. Another large lot, averaging 350 lbs., was sold for \$2,000.00, or \$5.71 per head. The export of hogs this week was only \$200,000, and the movement of specie southward has been light, hardly greater than the receipts from Philadelphia and Baltimore.

The Cincinnati Gazette of yesterday says: "The past week has been characterized by a considerable degree of activity in the money market. About one million in currency has been withdrawn since our last date, on account of the sale of bonds, and the market is close, as continued in advance of the receipts, as that, as compared with last Tuesday, the supply of currency shows a material falling off. A further contraction is expected, and the discount rate, thus previously noticed, and interest are beginning to wear an aspect of stringency; yet we find no one for the old and new issues of bonds, and the market is still in a state of uncertainty.
