







CONDENSED NEWS.

FOUR THOUSAND miners struck at Andin in the Department Du Nord.

A bad washout has occurred on the Central Pacific Railroad at Mill City, Cal.

M. Francis Coppe and M. De Lesseps have been elected members of the Academie Francaise.

The difficulty between Madsen and Meyer, art critic of the Goulois, has been settled by arbitration from the painter.

A newspaper from St. Louis says John Long stabbed John Fields to death in a brutal manner Friday morning for slandering his wife.

Frank Bodine, a New Jersey glass manufacturer, addressed the House Committee on Ways and Means, Friday, against the reduction of the duty on tiled bottles.

The House Committee on Foreign Affairs, considered on Friday the subjects of Chinese immigration, Herr Lasker and the Hewitt O'Donnell resolutions. The session was secret.

The body of a man, supposed to be Paul Moore, the author of the Passion Play, was found Friday morning in the East River at the foot of Thirty-second street, New York.

The London Times says, that, considering the condition of the political parties in Germany, it may be doubted if Bismarck could with safety to his domestic measures have accepted the Lasker resolution.

A thousand feet of snow sheds have been crushed in at Emery and Gay, Cal., by the weight of the snow. A Westbound freight train crashed into the sheds and twelve cars were wrecked. No lives were lost.

The brig Merriwa, from Amboy, bound to Boston with coal, gone ashore on the eastern end of Nantucket. The cargo and vessel will be a total loss. The crew were rescued by the life saving station at Great Point.

The Allgemeine Zeitung accuses Minister Sargent of degrading the office of Minister by using it to further his ambition in American politics. It asserts that he hopes by demagogism to influence future votes in his favor.

The steamer James Sampson, running between Kittery Point and Newcastle, sank at her landing at the foot of Duane street, Portsmouth, N. H., during the recent gale. Immediate efforts will be made to raise her.

SHADYER'S reports two hundred and eighteen failures in the United States during the past week. The number is twenty-five less than the preceding week and fifteen more than the corresponding week of 1882, and is eighty-three more than the same week of 1881.

The United States Smelting Company, of Philadelphia, of which George Hunt is the proprietor, has failed. The liabilities, which are over \$1,000,000 are said to be nowhere covered by the assets, which the creditors think will scarcely cover the second claim.

The Grand Lodge of the Knights of Honor held its seventeenth annual session in Brantford, Ontario, Canada, it was presided over by John P. Hudby, Grand Dictator. There are in the country thirty-six grand and 2,700 subordinate lodges, and about 185,000 members.

The Agricultural Appropriation bill has been reported to the House by Mr. Dibble (Connecticut), of the Agricultural Committee. It appropriates \$200,000 for the next fiscal year. The estimate of the Department was \$102,100 and the appropriations for the current year were \$160,500.

The Stewart House and some half dozen stores at Palmyra, Wis., were burned yesterday, involving a loss of \$20,000. The guests of the hotel escaped in their nightclothes, and suffered intensely from the cold weather. The women citizens were injured while attempting to save their goods.

In a cock fight held in Westchester, N. Y., five pairs of birds were fought out of a proposed main of eleven birds. The stake money was \$20 a battle and twice that amount on the additional fight. The birds represented Westchester and Long Island. The Westchester roosters had it all their way, having won every the whole five of the battles.

In the House of Commons the Speaker read a letter from Mr. Bradlaugh, stating that he would take no action in regard to assuming his seat in the House until the legality of the election taken by him had been passed upon by the House. Mr. Bradlaugh's protest, and moved that he be not permitted to take his seat. The motion was carried—236 to 178. Mr. Bradlaugh was thereupon ordered by the Speaker to withdraw, and left the House.
