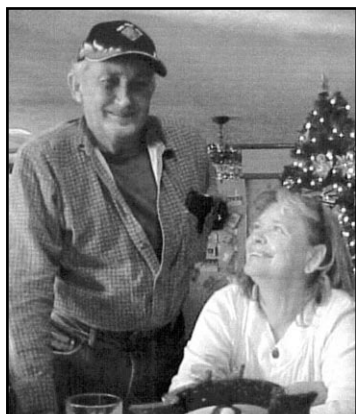

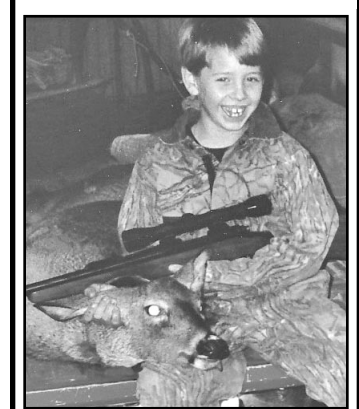

"What do you see?" Chloe asked as I made it to the top of the boxes and peered in the windows.

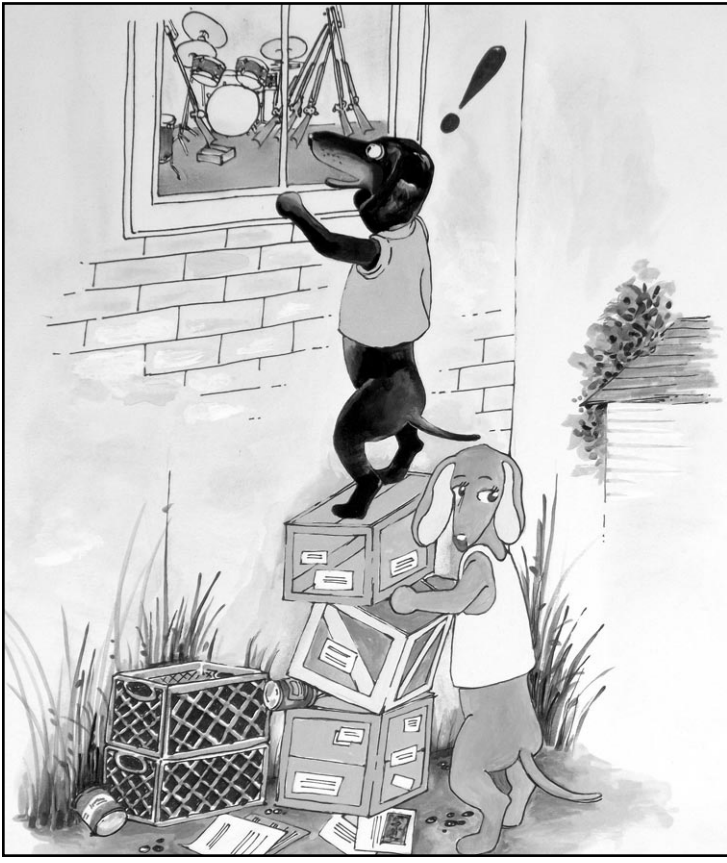

**Searching for British Cannon**

Two other researchers and I are tracing the history of the pair of British Pattison light three pounder cannon, one of which may still be sunk in the river at Bird's Crossing where it slipped off a makeshift bridge, mired, and was abandoned. Local folklore claims boys used to dive to touch the cannon in earlier days.

We have traced the cannon's histories from their tests at Woolwich in England, across the Atlantic, thru the Great lakes on the vessel Hope, to Detroit, then to Ruddle's Fort, thru the lakes on the vessel Faith once again to a landing on Lake Erie or at the river. The guns were put on freight canoes and went downriver landing at Sandusky accompanied by one British artillery officer and 24 rangers (12 for each gun) to join up with other Butler's troops and Indians to fight Col. Wm.

Crawford's militia. The guns arrived too late for Crawford's defeat and were sent to participate in the battle of Blue Licks. After Blue Licks the gun mired and sunk.

A team of experienced Gulf salvage divers and archaeologists are interested in searching for the gun, but first we must get more local information (especially if the gun still remains), and details of course changes, possible property rights, as the river was divided between KY and OH twice and the possibility of a course change that might have put the gun on private land. Only one example of this style gun is on the American continent in a museum in Canada.

City of Butler, Kentucky  
 Ordinance No. 411

**AN ORDINANCE MAKING THE TAX LEVY FOR THE YEAR 2011 AND FIXING A PENALTY FOR THE FAILURE TO PAY.**

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BUTLER KENTUCKY AS FOLLOWS:**

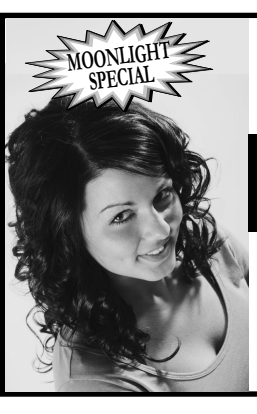
1. The ad valorem tax levy for the year 2011 for the general fund shall be \$0.429 per \$100.00 of assessed value of real estate, improvements and personal property will be \$1.140 per \$100.00.
2. The City shall have a lien for five years from the date of the assessment on the property of each person or corporation for all taxes due to the City. This lien shall not be defeated by gift, devise, alienation or other means and there shall be no exemption from levy or sale for taxes.
3. All taxes shall be due and payable on the 31<sup>st</sup> of December 2011. If not paid by January 31, 2012 such taxes shall be delinquent and all delinquent taxes shall bear interest at the rate of ten percent per annum from January 31, 2012. In addition, all delinquent taxpayers shall pay a penalty of ten percent on delinquent taxes.
4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict, or to the extent of such conflict, are hereby repealed.
5. This ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and publication according to law.

## Picture the world around you with 4-H photography project

Our surroundings are full of interesting and unusual things that many miss in this hectic life. The 4-H Photography Project gives youth the opportunity to become more aware of the unique world around us.

Youth gain many benefits in the exciting photography project. They can record information for other 4-H projects and maintain visual records of their family and friends and important events in their lives. Their photography experiences could lay the foundation for a good start in a professional career.

The photography project is a self-exploration endeavor, because youth take the initiative to plan, carry out, and evaluate the learning process.

Members develop basic skills in a logical sequence. Topics include the elements of photography, parts and operation of a camera, types of cameras and film, and planning, composing, and taking various types of photographs. Participants experiment with composition, lighting, distance, and movement among other photography theories.

These hands-on camera experiences give youth many opportunities to explore and discover. The active approach to

learning introduces, teaches, and reinforces photography skills.

Youth also develop and master many life skills including acquiring, analyzing, and using information, solving problems, making decisions, managing resources, communicating with and relating to others, and working with groups. Members also develop artistic expression and learn to recognize and accept differences. Equally important, 4-Hers develop self-esteem through pride in their photographic accomplishments.

Collectively, all these skills enable 4-H members to develop workforce preparation expertise that is a lifetime benefit. 4-H members are encouraged to take the initiative to share these new skills and knowledge with other youth and adults.

The 4-H photography project has two age-appropriate divisions. "Beginning Adventures with Your Camera" is for youth eight to 10 years old. "More Adventures with Your Camera" is for ages 11 years and older.
